
BAPTISM:

The Pastor's Corner Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

The Easter proclamation unites time and eternity in jubilant celebration, yesterday, today and tomorrow we proclaim with conviction in faith and experience that Christ is Risen, Christ is risen indeed, Alleluia!

This glorious revelation for celebration began when Mary Magdalene and the disciples discovered an empty tomb and grew to appreciate the mysterious presence of the Risen Lord Jesus, in the midst of the various encounters they experienced. Mary recognized Him as he called her by name. The disciples recognized him as they broke bread together and in the varied appearances. He made delivering peace, forgiveness and empowerment to their lives and ministry. Individually and collectively the disciples of Jesus were transformed by His risen presence. We live now in joyful hope for a glorious future in Him who died and was raised from the dead. We now move from 40 days of fasting to 50 days of feasting! He is Risen as He Said, Alleluia!

The joyful celebration expressed here today in our Easter Songs and liturgies emanate from our faith filled experiences of the Risen Lord in our lives and relationships with God and one another. We gather as a community of faith united with the whole Church, the people of faith throughout the world and through time who have continuously proclaimed the truth of the Easter message. We are witnesses of this truth in our own life and time and are dedicated to living and proclaiming the Gospel message that is most joyfully celebrated on this holiest feast day of the Church. Thank you for being with us for this great celebration.

You and all are welcome to St. Joan of Arc Parish at Easter time, and always to be here with us. Come, worship and participate in the Christian life of the Church. As a family of faith, we are called to be Stewards of the Message and the ministry of Jesus Christ in all that we are and all that we do and say as a parish.
