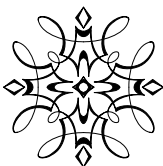

**The Pastor's Corner**  
*Peace and Goodness to All!*

Today begins the holiest season of the liturgical year. Today, Palm Sunday we enter the church with Jesus remembering the crowds who cheered His triumphal entry into Jerusalem as the King of humility. We sing with them Hosanna to the Son of David and then we will assemble to listen as the long and sorrowful story of his passion and death is retold. Once again we are invited to hear of the mockery and the trial of injustice that condemned him to death. We once again remember and consider the abandonment and betrayal he experienced from his closest friends and disciples. We consider those who were present and close to the event and we are invited to contemplate our own part in these events that continue to speak to our own times and lives. The passion narrative from Matthew's gospel read today remembers the events that happened in Jerusalem from the betrayal of Jesus, and the preparation of the Seder Meal at Passover celebrated by Jesus and His disciples, through the recognition of Jesus as the Son of God, and the sealing of the stone covered tomb. The density of the narrative makes it impossible to contemplate its meaning in one reading. And so, the Church unfolds the story throughout the liturgies of Holy Week, and most clearly articulates the completion of the story in the Triduum liturgy of Holy Thursday through the Easter Vigil.

We invite all of you to participate fully in the holy week liturgies and especially in the Triduum celebrations so you can more deeply appreciate the mystery of salvation that is annually remembered here. Contemplating our own lives as they are touched and illuminated by the gospel each year brings special insights and blessings in the way that Christ is present for each of us. We are invited each year to identify where the gospel narratives touch our present life circumstances. With which facet or persons in the gospel might you or I identify differently or specifically this year. Where are we at the table of the Lord's Supper and how do we drink from the cup of salvation? Are you like Simon, called to help Jesus to carry the cross? Are you like Peter, denying the Lord? Are you like one of the holy women grieving? Are you Mary or John at the foot of the Cross? As each of us celebrates the liturgies, the significance of the story and liturgical action makes it impact felt. Our knowledge of God's presence and the salvation won for us by the cross and resurrection of Christ is more fully appreciated, so that the depth of our appreciation enriches our lives and participation in the Church.

We pray that the Holy Spirit may inspire and enlighten us in our Holy Week celebrations, so that we may experience most fully the dynamic power of Christ the Resurrection and the life at Easter.
