

THE PASTOR'S CORNER Peace and Goodness to All!

Today, Passion Sunday we carry palms to remember the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem where he will fulfill his mission of Atonement and Salvation for us all. This day begins the holiest week of the liturgical year which will culminate in the Triduum Celebration. This is one long liturgy that begins on Holy Thursday, continues through Good Friday and culminates in the Easter Vigil on Saturday night. On Tuesday the Archbishop will gather with all of the priests of the Archdiocese in the cathedral for the annual Chrism mass. At this time he will bless the holy oils for sacramental celebrations throughout the year, and together the priests will renew our promised commitments. This is actually a sort of preliminary celebration of Holy Thursday liturgy, but there is too much going on to include these ceremonies on Holy Thursday at the Cathedral. As we consider all that we remember in the Holy Week Liturgies it is good to reflect on why the celebration of holy week is extended for a whole week. It is because the intensity of the drama, and the immensity of what Christ accomplished in the days leading up to his Passion, death and Resurrection are too much to contain in one sitting.

As we listen to the Passion Narrative today from St. Matthew it is important that we listen to the details so that we may identify with the various characters involved in the scenes recollected here. It is important that we allow the Holy Spirit to inspire us to identify with the individuals in the story that have an impact on our personal lives and relationships, at home, at work or among our colleagues and friends. The story brings light and redemption into the real world we live in. As we proceed through Holy Week, it is important to be present for the Triduum liturgies. These remember all that happened in a processional way that slows down the action so we can better perceive our own involvement in the mystery of salvation. As Jesus washed the feet of the disciples he was preparing them to be servants as they were served in this anointing. We celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist and as we process to the tabernacle for a time of prayer and vigil, we remember that Jesus asked his disciples to watch and pray with Him the night before his death. On Good Friday we will listen to the Gospel of John which presents an image of the Lord Jesus triumphant in his witness to the truth. Jesus voice is strongly reflective of what he is about. We then wait prayerfully through a quiet day on Saturday remembering the sorrow doubt and fear that was the disciples in the time of waiting.

The Easter Vigil will begin in the dark with the Easter Fire, the exhultet will be sung and we will recall Salvation History in the readings. We will celebrate the return of the Gloria and Alleluia in song and jubilation. We will rejoice with the Baptisms of the elect from the RCIA and RCIC programs and receive and Confirm the others, who have been preparing to receive the Easter Sacraments. Holy Week prepares us to celebrate Easter with and unparalleled depth of appreciation. If you are a regular participant in the annual celebrations, you know. If you have never fully participated in these feasts, you owe it to yourself to experience the intense love of God that is poured out in these liturgies.

May the Passion of the Lord Jesus Christ fill your hearts and lives this year with abundant love and blessings.
