

The Friar's Nook

It's great to be back after three weeks of travelling, I hope your Lent is going well. As the province opens up, so do things at church. So, I thought I'd give you an update on where we stand for current Safe Worship practices. First of all, all of the pews are open so that we can begin to accommodate the numbers of parishioners we had before the pandemic.

Second, you'll notice that the tape has been removed from the main body of the church as well as the balcony. For those who wish to continue to social distance, the pews in the Chapel are so marked and those sitting in the Chapel have their own eucharistic minister. We hope that this will encourage more people to feel comfortable coming back to church.

Third, we will continue to wear masks in church until we hear from the diocese that it's no longer

required and then we will re-evaluate. My goal is to make sure that everyone is safe and that

everyone feels comfortable coming to church.

I'm hoping not to jinx things, but it looks like for the first time as pastor of Saint Joan of Arc, we will be celebrating Holy Week! There are a couple of adaptations do to COVID but not a lot of changes. On Palm Sunday, you will be handed a palm as you come into the church, and they will be blessed together at the beginning of the Mass. On Holy Thursday, for the Mass of the Lord's Supper, things will go as usual - meaning we will have a foot washing. This means that I need folks to volunteer to have their foot washed prior to Holy Week so that we can set things up accordingly. On Good Friday, there will be no communal veneration of the cross this year. I will venerate it, and there will be a time for private prayer and reflection. We will have an Easter vigil on Saturday and at this point the 10:00 AM Mass on Sunday.

As I mentioned before, we need to get our ministries back up and running. Those of you who have served in a ministry and wish to continue need to contact the office preferably by email with the ministry or ministries you wish to serve in. Don't worry about what Masses you want to work at at this time, we'll deal with that once we have a list of ministers for each of the ministries. Remember we need Greeters, Ushers, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Servers, Music Ministers, and Sacristans! If you have not served in a ministry and wish to join one or several please email us so that we can add you to the lists. Training will be provided and when the schedule is made, we will work with your preferences on when you want to serve. As it is we're having a hard enough time finding ministers for the 5:30 Mass on Saturday and the 10:00 AM Mass on Sunday! So, as you can see, we need more ministers serving the congregation. Once we have enough people willing to serve, we will begin to open up additional Masses again.

I am also looking to start an Environment and Art committee for the church. During COVID, I have been left to my own devices in terms of decorating for seasons and celebrations in the church and would welcome a committee to take this over. Again, I will provide training for this so that everyone has an understanding about art and environment in the church.

I remind you to please go to the archdiocesan website and fill out the 11 questions for the Synod.

The Synod on Synodality: Share Your Thoughts

Pope Francis has launched the Synod on Synodality, an ambitious twoyear global process of listening to the faithful. "Synod" comes from an ancient Greek word meaning "walking together on the road." There have been many synods in the history of the Church, but these have traditionally been opportunities for bishops to come together to determine the path forward for the Church. With the Synod on Synodality, Pope Francis is asking every Catholic to help discern what the Holy Spirit is telling us at this moment as the Church enters its third millennium. The first phase of the Synod on Syndodality will last through the first half of 2022 and will see the world's faithful sharing their thoughts at a diocesan level. All those diocesan-level responses will be collected and summarized. Then the bishops of Canada will meet to discuss what they heard in their respective dioceses, followed by larger multinational meetings and, ultimately, culminating in a synod of bishops in the Vatican in 2023.
