

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

Today, Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday, we celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. We greet the Lord with the hymn of the ages: Hosanna to the King of Glory! The jubilant praises soon go silent as the liturgical procession leads to the memory of the betrayal, arrest, and false conviction of Jesus which will lead us to recount the story of his passion and death. In remembering this story we begin our Holy Week celebrations.

The Church tells the story every year in the procession of days that will lead to Easter so that we can contemplate the depths of meaning that are contained as the story unfolds. Throughout the week there will be celebrations to focus on various facets of the Lord's passion so we can grow in our awareness and our gratitude for the Love of God poured out in the Life of the Savior.

On Tuesday at the Cathedral, the Cardinal will gather with the clergy and faithful of the Archdiocese for the Chrism Mass, where the holy sacramental oils will be blessed, and the foundation of Priesthood is remembered and celebrated. Because it is my 25^{th} year as a priest, I have been invited to participate especially with the Cardinal and other jubilations in this event.

Thursday begins the sacred Triduum, the three day liturgy that begins with Holy Thursday and continues through the Easter Vigil. These are the most Sacred days of the year, and we encourage all to participate as fully as possible in these liturgical celebrations that mark the highest holy days. On Tuesday we will receive the oils, blessed by the Cardinal, then, we will have the mass of the Lord's Supper, where we remember that Jesus washed the feet of the disciples with the mandate: "as I have done so you also should do". As the Eucharist comes to a close, the Blessed Sacrament will be processed around the church and brought to the altar of repose for adoration and quiet prayer.

Friday is Good Friday and on this day we will focus on the Death of the Lord from the Gospel of John, which remembers the witness that Jesus bares before the powers of the world. As the truth of God, He stands before the illusions of power that falsely condemn Him to the scandal of the Cross. In this liturgy we venerate the Lord who passed through his death to win eternal life and salvation for us all. In this celebration the Church prays for the redemption of all people of good will. In contemplating what Jesus has done for us, we appreciate that his death has won salvation for all.

Saturday evening at dusk, we will begin the Easter Vigil with the lighting of the Easter Fire. This begins the high point of our Pascal celebrations. The readings to recount salvation history will be recited, and we will announce the Easter proclamation of the Gospel. Several adults and children from our RCIA and RCIC programs will be baptized, and we will receive several other Christians into full communion with the Catholic Church in this celebration. Our Choirs have combined to sing throughout the liturgies no doubt they will be beautiful

We are deeply blessed to have the rich participation of so many parishioners who make these celebrations resonate with the power of the Holy Spirit who communicates the Love of God and the Salvation that is won for us in Jesus. We hope you will consider attending all of these celebrations so you may participate fully in the life and worship of the Church that is present for you at St. Joan of Arc Parish.
