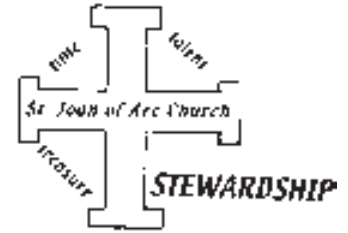

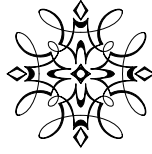

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to you and yours.

For the past two weeks, I have been discussing the Stewardship of our parish community. Two weeks ago we began by talking about Liturgical worship as the source and summit of our life and ministry here at St. Joan of Arc parish. Last week, I illustrated how our ministries grow from worship in organic development to meet the evangelical needs of the parish through integration of new members and ongoing education and development for the community. We also touched on some of the outreach that is provided by the parish to help us realize our Christian vocation to serve God and others. It is impossible to cover adequately, the full range of ministries that are provided by the parish in three short articles, but our hope is that you will have a clearer idea of the opportunities for Stewardship that are open to you through our parish.

Here at St. Joan of Arc we also host some very important organizations that bring life and holiness and support to our community. Primary among these is the *Catholic Woman's League*, the CWL. This group of women have been with St. Joan of Arc 46 years as a group of women whose social outreach, political advocacy, hands on participation in all of our organizations, and material support through fund raisers, and other activities has been a backbone of Christian life and devotion in the Spirit of Mary the Mother of God. *The St. Vincent DePaul Society* has also been a long mainstay of care for the poor and underprivileged in our midst. The *Knights of Columbus* are represented in our monthly First Friday Devotions, as they participate here and several of the surrounding parishes.

On very practical levels we have a *Gardening Committee* to keep our grounds and gardens beautiful (even in the midst of construction). *Our Building Committee* has been focusing on assisting the *Capital Campaign Committee* to bring about the current renovations and is looking toward becoming a Building maintenance committee in the future to forecast needed repairs and renovations before they become urgencies. Our *Finance Committee* provides oversight, foresight, and advisory governance to the pastor for the solvency and financial health of the parish. These groups work together sharing expertise and assistance for the material well being of the Parish. We are always seeking new volunteers in these areas to step in to rotating terms of service.

In the past three weeks I have named over two dozen different organizations and ministries of the parish. These groups are coordinated for the sake of communication and interaction through a network of representatives on our *Parish Council*. Together with the Pastoral team, the Council works to realize good Stewardship in building our relationships to utilize our resources and talents for the continued growth and development of the parish community. Most of our parish committees and organizations are represented by members of the parish council.

However, there are other groups and services that gather here at St. Joan of Arc that deserve mention.

(Continued from page 1) To enhance Christian life and formation, we offer hospitality to a *meditation group*, a *Taize* prayer service which is an ecumenical prayer gathering, and a *Marion prayer* gathering that meets some of the devotional needs of the parish. Sr. Elizabeth has provided some scripture study as she has walked with those who “*Stroll thru Scripture*” as a faith sharing ministry, and we are open to the possibility of a scripture study group growing in the future

. We welcome inquiries that involve development to promote spiritual growth in the community and as ever, we seek individual volunteers to develop and sustain these devotional and faith building opportunities.

St Joan of Arc Community provides a wealth of opportunity for everyone in the parish to become involved in Stewardship Activities. As the summer progresses we are illustrating this reality to prepare the ground for our Stewardship Weekend in September. Our aim is to proclaim this Spirit of Stewardship in Christ, and strengthen our community participation so that we may indeed mirror the Kingdom of God that the Gospel Proclaims. We hope to help everyone see how they might become involved in the life of the parish in ways that fit the particular needs and life schedules that are possible for each family or situation. Please ask God in your prayers and consider how you may be called to serve the community in your life.

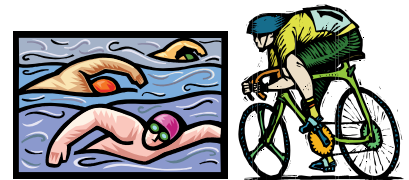
