# The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to All!

In the silence that followed the fury of the hurricane winds and an earthquake, Elijah heard the presence of the Lord. In the boat tossed about in midst of a terrible storm at sea, Jesus met the disciples with his message, Take heart, it is I, do not be afraid. Peter ventured out to meet Jesus but was overcome by fear. Jesus taking Peter to the boat, as the great winds ceased, brought God's presence to their consciousness and they worshiped him. Both of the stories from this Sunday's readings help inspire us to seek the Lord in the midst of life struggles. Both suggest faith as the ground to recognize God's presence in the peace that follows turmoil. The summer brings time for us to contemplate the Word of God that is communicated in nature, and is recognized in the scriptures that recount the stories of God's faithfulness to Israel, and to the early Church. Even in the midst of our struggles and difficulties, we are encouraged to always seek the Lord and find the peace of Christ that is beyond understanding. To worship God as the disciples and Elijah did in their experiences. The challenge to pray even when we are afraid that we may never loose heart is one that we share with St. Peter and the disciples. Listening for the Word of God in prayer requires seeking to be attentive in all situations for God's presence. The assurance Christ gives us at the end of Matthew's gospel confirms us in faith as Jesus commands his disciples, "Remember I am with you always, even to the end of time."

Certainly the news of the trials now being experienced in Israel and Gaza, the Ukraine, Syria, the Sudan, Afghanistan, and other places in the world bring sorrow and heartbreak to our minds as we think of the terrible suffering experienced by so many. The stories of violence in the streets, poverty and addiction that plagues our cities make us wonder and perhaps worry about the world in which our children are growing up. Family worries, and problems that come with ill health, aging, and broken relationships can preoccupy our thoughts and bring worry. Loneliness, depression, doubts and fears can sometimes cloud our consciousness. Such are sometimes the storms that surround us in our search for God to help us. These are distractions from the truth that Christ has conquered, all evil by his death on the cross, and has united us with God for all time to bring us through all evil to the peace of God's Kingdom. Pray always and never loose heart is the wisdom we are given in Jesus. Prayer is the place where our troubles melt before the presence of God who is with us to unite us all in the struggle of the Cross and its victory of life and eternal salvation.

Next Friday we celebrate the great feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. Mary the sinless virgin who harboured the Savior of the world in her womb, was invited by the angel to receive the presence of the Lord in her womb. Even as she questioned how can this be, she responded, " Let it be done unto me according to your Word." Giving birth to the Saviour, She did not foresee the struggles it would bring her nor the scandal of the cross that would take her beloved Son.

Her prayerful and sorrowful dignity sustained her through the agony of the cross to experience the glory of His blessed Resurrection. Her prayerful heart and disposition is a model for us to emulate in our lives and the questions life brings.

She was spared death and was taken up to heaven, the mother of Jesus, and the mother of the Church. Her Assumption into heaven is given to show us the destiny that is held out to all who believe in the power of the Cross to bring us eternal redemption. Let us pray with Mary for the Church throughout the world that Christ may bring the light of faith into the darkness of the world. May our constant prayerful hope, help us to birth love into the world by the grace of God who is with us until the end of time.
