

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all of you.

The readings this Sunday encourage a sense of evangelization for the Church. When we talk about evangelization, it is not a matter of imposing our faith upon other people, rather, it is demonstrating God's gracious love in our lives, so that others may come to know the Lord and find the true freedom we have as God's family in faith.

I couldn't help but think of how this works in many of our own families or among our friends. As the summer progresses, many of us have had opportunities to be with some of our family members, brothers and sisters, cousins and old friends. It is interesting to me that my own family and circle of friends have provided for me, what I see as a sort of window on the Church as it is in the real world today.

Some members of the family continue to practice their faith, while others have discontinued regular Church going. Some have stopped going to church while at university, or perhaps because of failed marriages, or other tragic circumstances. Others seem to have just let other activities take priority over the practice of going to Mass. Some of the family would not miss Sunday Mass for anything, while others may go to Church occasionally or on Holy Days. It seems to me that the struggles, challenges, and pressures, as well as the blessings, benefits and ordinary occurrences that life brings to bear on everyone happen to people almost randomly, regardless of their conscious participation in the life of the Church. What does make a difference, however, is the way those who continue to be people of faith are graced to respond to life events and relationships as they unfold.

Those who continue to practice their faith seem to have their lives centered around the Lord. When the bumps that inevitably come along in the road of life occur, the strength and grace available to them, keeps them grounded. What is more, often they will inspire those who may not be conscious of the Lords presence to wonder how they can be so strong or graceful under the circumstances. Furthermore, it seems that the members of the family, who don't practice the faith, often lean on those who do continue in this, perhaps even asking them to pray for them in their difficulties. The mysterious quality of God's presence becomes apparent in these situations. This is where true evangelization takes place. When blessings or accomplishments come to bear on the lives of the ones who continue to practice the faith, their humble gratitude seems contagious to the others and to inspire a bit of wonder. God's graciousness becomes apparent and non-threatening.

The gospel this week tells us to "enter by the narrow gate" that the road that leads to destruction is wide. The narrow gate is the way of the Lord. This is provided in the practice of our Faith in Christ Jesus. His life and teaching demonstrate compassion, wisdom and love for all people. The teachings of the Church and the discipline of practicing our religious faith keep us grounded in the Lord, and centered on the real live presence of God with us in all of life's experiences, whether difficult or pleasant.

Jesus is the very presence of God who became one with us in our humanity so we can recognize his being with us in all of life. He sent us the Holy Spirit so we could become aware of what this means each day in our lives and relationships. God's love is our enlightenment and peace. It is His grace that empowers us to bring his life and love to all of life's circumstances and situations in the particularity of our family's and circles of friends. In this way others may come to know the Love of God that embraces all and simply inspires us to make our lives blessed and holy in the real world that we live in.

May we always keep our hearts set on Christ and the world to come. Let's keep our eyes set on the Lord with us each day so that we may be united in the gift of faith and bring others to know the hope we have in God who is the source and focus of our lives.

May God Bless you in the Love that brings joy and peace to all.
