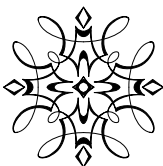

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to All!

The Sunday readings today focus on God's presence precisely where it is not expected. Elijah is told to go outside to experience God's passing and is mystified to find that only after the passing of powerful wind and fire does revelation come in the silence. Jesus retires to a place of prayerful communion with the Father, while his disciples are anxiously struggling in a storm swept boat in the middle of the sea. As he leaves his repose to meet them walking on the storm tossed waves they think he is a ghost, and then realize who he is. Peter steps out of the boat to meet Jesus in the midst of the raging sea and is distracted from his focus and sinks pleading for safety. Jesus pulls him up with the familiar words; "Oh you of little faith". Calm ensues at Jesus' command and they acknowledge the power of peace delivered by the Son of God.

The presence of God in both instances is revealed in silence and peace. Turbulence brings fear and distraction. This is true not only in the natural powers of nature and weather, but also in the physical and emotional experiences that life brings in the day to day struggles we experience. Life it seems is often challenged by sickness, disease, broken relationships, the fears of current or impending unemployment, the loss of a loved one, loneliness, or even boredom. It is often only when we have trouble that we remember to turn to God for help in needy situations. What is behind each of the stories here is the message that God is always with us, ever present and always in charge. Sustaining a mindful awareness of this fact requires prayerful attention. Sustaining prayerful attention to God's presence is perhaps best insured by developing the habit of daily prayer and meditation. Time spent in prayer prepares us to sustain a faithful grounding in God's love that keeps us prepared for the inevitable challenges that will come our way. It will also give us the ability to share our faith with others in their struggles so they can learn how to turn to God who is always with us to help, guide and sustain everyone who asks.

As the summer weeks progress, let's ask God to help us sustain a prayer life that is regular, deep and real, so we can navigate life in peace and help others along the way.

A word of Thank you, to all who have sponsored the Iron Friar Campaign. This week, Ken Van Winkle will be coming to help us plan the new signage for the Church. He will give us some mock up images to work with and present to the building maintenance committee and others here before we decide what to do. It looks like the cost will almost be covered by the proceeds from the Iron Friar. Thank you again.

ShareLife

Please be advised, the 2011 Sharelife Campaign is now **closed** and we have sent our cheque downtown. We have received some Sharelife donations late. It was published in the bulletin that donations had to be into the parish by July 25th. Each year the campaign closes in July and we have to mail our cheque by July 31st. So any donations we now receive for Sharelife have to be held until next year's campaign opens up.

Sharelife Relief for East Africa

The ShareLife Office is accepting donations for disaster relief efforts in East Africa. Working with our partners at the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development & Peace/Caritas Canada, the Catholic Church's official relief representative in Canada, funds will be channelled to Caritas organizations on the ground. Throughout the region, Caritas has mobilized, supplying food aid, clean water and medical and veterinary aid. Current reports suggest more than 200,000 people are receiving assistance through the Caritas network at present. Cheques can be made payable to St. Joan of Arc Parish/ShareLife and on the memo line mark East Africa Relief. The parish will then send one cheque on behalf of the parish community.

Some dos and don'ts when you go to church.

Did you see the Catholic Register last week? There was some very good advice in it about going to church. A parishioner asked if some points could be put in this week's bulletin. "This is the house of God for the purpose of prayer, adoration and reflection". We are asked before mass begins to turn off our cell phones, but we still hear phones ringing. "Dress appropriately", especially if you are serving as a Lector, Eucharistic Minister or Server. Our parish does have a dress code set up for ministries. Children don't need to bring toys or snacks to church. Adults shouldn't need to bring food and water to mass. Arrive at mass on time.
