The Friar's Nook

I hope you've noticed when you've been at Mass, the large circle in front of the altar is getting more and more filled up. The figures on this circle have been made by the children of this parish and I must say some of them are fascinating. I would recommend you take some time to look at them up closely because some of them have words written on them as well as an image of the child who made it. There are words like love, hope, and peace.

Last Sunday a young girl came to me after Mass and asked me if this was hope Sunday or love Sunday. I simply smiled and said "Let's call it hope Sunday, because every Sunday should be love Sunday." It pleased me to see someone so young thinking about things so profound. I'm glad that she noticed the change in the church because it's supposed to speak to us and draw us deeper into the season.

This also brings to mind the words of the prophet Isaiah that we hear throughout the Advent season:

"The wolf will live with the lamb, the leopard will lie down with the goat, the calf and the lion and the yearling together; and a little child will lead them."

The reason Isaiah talks about a child leading us, is because as an adult we often get in our own way not to mention getting in the way of others. We might lead people but it's going to be according to our way not necessarily according to God's way. I often joke that it's so easy to say in the Lord's prayer, "Thy Kingdom come, my will be done." I believe the older we get the harder it can be to follow God's will in the easier it is to believe that our will is in fact gods will.

Hence, as Isaiah mentions, we need a child to lead us. Someone without guile or self will, that may lead us along the way of God's will. 2000 years ago, we had one such child when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Today we need to look for that same honesty in sincerity in the little ones that are around us that they may be a source of the purity and goodness of God to us and to the world.
