### The Friar's Nook

Today we celebrate Gaudete Sunday. It comes from the Latin meaning "Rejoice!" The exclamation mark is appropriate because it is a command not a suggestion. It shows the church is just as excited about the coming of Christmas as we are!

I remember as a child that I couldn't wait to get our Christmas tree set up. From the beginning of December, I would nag my parents to get a tree. The problem is, getting a live tree on December 1st doesn't guarantee you'll have a live tree on December 25th. So, my parents would put it off until mid-December. I couldn't wait to put the lights and the decorations on the tree because, once this was done, then we could start putting our presents under the tree. Any gifts we had that we were giving to others, brothers, sisters, mom and dad, cousins, we're all kept under the tree. So as Christmas approached the underside of the tree became a festive Wonderland. It was hard not checking out presents that were earmarked for me. Then would come the making of Christmas cookies, and watching Christmas specials on TV with our cousins. It only served to stir up the excitement and gave real meaning to the word "rejoice."

This is one of the two times of the year when we get to wear pink! I don't have pink Crocs, nor do I want them, but we do have a set of pink vestments or should I say "rose coloured" vestments. We wear them on this Sunday to brighten things up and hopefully show our joy. We also wear them on Laetare Sunday in Lent but for an entirely different reason. In Lent, we celebrate that we're halfway through and almost done with the Lenten season. In Advent, we celebrate that we're halfway through and have almost reached Christmas!

I know this year for most of you Christmas will be a very different experience. It will probably be one with fewer people around but there's no less reason to celebrate because Christ came and will come again, and we still have Him and each other, even if we aren't present physically to each other. As I learned from "How the Grinch Stole Christmas", nothing can steal Christmas - it comes anyway we simply need to look for it and "rejoice."

Around the Friary, I have decorated and will begin decorating in the church next week. I still have five storage bins of Christmas decorations that I haven't used! My predecessor decorated every square inch of space. I'm a little less extravagant. But I will celebrate! I hope that you are in the pink as well. As a friend of mine always tells me, "Be proactive". Don't let the hope and expected joy of Christmas fade away. Plan on doing something to celebrate any way that you can – remember I'm not wearing pink vestments for no reason!

For American Thanksgiving, I knew that I was going to be alone so instead of moping, I made a turkey dinner with all the trimmings (except dessert because I can use a little trimming). Then I arranged to video chat with my family. Yes, it wasn't the same as being there, but it was really good to see and talk to them. Amazingly, love can travel across the internet!


