### The Friar's Nook

As a person who works for the church, I love the 4th Sunday of Advent. With all the hustle and bustle of the season and the things we "need to do", the 4th Sunday of Advent reminds us that the time is short - Christmas is coming!

I say this not to throw people into a panic but rather, to remind people that now is the time to relax. Instead of a last-minute scramble, to get everything done For Christmas, settle for the things that are already done. The world won't come to an end if you haven't dotted every i and crossed every t, if all the right gifts weren't purchased, if all the food wasn't prepared just so. Now is the time to begin to quiet down inside, especially, with all the noise that's outside. If we take this time to be still, we can begin to hear what's, especially important and come to celebrate Christmas as we ought to.

The way it looks now, we will probably still be closed for Christmas. But that won't stop us from celebrating the love of God that has come to us, leads us, and will come to take us to Himself. We are planning, at this point, to live stream the Christmas Eve Mass at 5:30 PM and the Christmas day Mass at 10:00 AM. I will certainly miss seeing all of you, the young and the old alike, and being with you but that just reminds me of the goodness God has shown me here with you. And I know the day will come, hopefully soon, when we are back together again to celebrate.


