Merry Christmas! I'd like to share with you a Christmas story, maybe not a miracle but I'll leave that up to you to decide. As most of you know I lost the parish puppy, Sonya, this summer to cancer. This fall, I asked the students from Marrocco-Merton high school and the students from Saint Luigi's elementary school to pray that God send me the right dog for the parish. Both groups were expecting to see her at their beginning of the school year Masses, so they were saddened at the news. As you know I've had to do a lot of traveling this fall, so I wasn't looking at getting a dog until Christmas time.

In November, I decided to start looking for a dog to see what was available in the area. I simply googled "dogs available for adoption near me." I started looking at pictures and names of dogs on the screen but stopped at one dog in particular. It was a picture over two month old puppy that they said is a Labrador retriever mix. She had floppy ears and brown fur. Her name was Kalamata - yes like the olive! I thought what kind of name is Kalamata for a dog so I clicked on it. It turns out that she was from Cairo, Egypt so it made a little bit more sense to me why she might have a peculiar name. As I read her story it turns out that she was a stray up until two months old when she was hit by a bus. Someone found her and brought her to a vet where she had to have the toes on her left foot amputated because they had been crushed. Her leg had also been broken in two places. Eventually it wouldn't heal and so they had to amputate her left leg. At this point I looked up to heaven and said to God "Is this a sign?" After all I hadn't googled "3 legged dogs near me."

I wrote to them expressing my interest and asking for an updated picture since they said she was a little over a year old. The picture I received did not look like a Labrador mix but like a leaner version of Sonya! When I met her, she came to me and hugged me as best she could. Her foster mom said that she was praying that Kalamata find a forever home for Christmas and she believed I was that home. She is a little shy but then again so was Sonya, but I think this is an answer to all the prayers.

As I said in the beginning, whether this is a Christmas miracle, or not, I do believe that prayer on both ends is what brought me and Kali (Kalamata is too formal) together. The story goes on, but I've run out of room. I hope she is a blessing both for me and the parish. Thank you for all of your prayers as well.
