# The Friar's Nook

As you probably can tell by the decor change in the church, we have begun a new season and in fact a new church year. Today because we begin the season of Advent. It's a time to "get ready". Surely, we probably think that getting ready is something we do for Christmas. But we think about buying presents, putting up decorations, celebrating parties, and the like. Advent, though, is time to prepare our lives and our hearts for God's greatest gift to us – His son Jesus who is "God with us".

When I was growing up, I remember we used to get an Advent calendar. No one really explained it to us, so as a child I thought it was simply a countdown 'till Christmas when the good day came! We had one for the whole family and we would alternate being the one to open the little doors to see what picture was behind them. Nowadays, they have Advent calendars with chocolates in them and even ones with whiskey in them for each day! In both cases, mine counting down till Christmas, and ones that give you a present each day, I think they miss the true meaning of Advent. What they should teach us is not a prolongation of Christmas but rather what Christmas is truly about. We were happy as children to open a flap and see a picture of a toy because it was a surprise. It felt like we were on a little treasure hunt leading us to Christmas.

As an adult, I think that's the best use of an Advent calendar. It should teach us that God has little surprises for us each day. Maybe not a toy, but something beautiful and wonderful. The real challenge is we don't simply have a little cardboard door to open, but we have to truly look for it each day in our lives. This doesn't simply happen during Advent, God is always gifting us with His presence and with His goodness, and therefore we should be seeking the presence of God and that goodness every day. But the season of Advent is a time to remind us of that. In the busyness of our lives, we so often forget about the goodness of God that is out there and available to us. We get so distracted by the things around us that we don't take time to open our eyes and ears to find the goodness and beauty of God each day.

I encourage you to spend at least this Advent season looking for the treasures each day that God has for us that we may be filled with his joy. That's the true preparation of Advent. So that when Christmas comes, we really understand it for what it is -- the great gift of God coming to us! After all, where do you think we get the word adventure from? Let us make this season of Advent the beginning of another adventure with God!
