Some of Our League's History

St. Joan of Arc's Catholic Women's League just had their **50th Anniversary** on January 8th, of this year. Over the years we have sponsored many activities: we had a club named "Do As You Wish", it changed to the "Over 50 Club", this group would play cards and do crafts on a Tuesday afternoon. We had a fashion show here at the parish, with our own members as the models and being able to order an outfit at the time; we sold tickets and attended a fashion show at Eaton's as a fundraiser. We shared New Year's Eve Dances with the Knights of Columbus.

We have purchased vestments, finger towels for the sacristy, a coffee urn, amplifiers for the original organ, and the old cupboards in the meeting room. We have supported fundraising for the parish, by contributing to the cost of a new roof, and the building fund when the extension was put on the parish hall and drapes for the Terrace Room.

In 1978, our council hosted a Citizenship court here in our own parish hall, I can't pass up the chance to tell you that the Royal Canadian Mountie standing on guard, for this function, actually fainted from the heat in our hall.

Over the years, we have sponsored, Emergency and Babysitting courses. We held receptions for the children receiving their First Communion and Confirmation.

In 1999, the parish had a rash of break-ins, and we contributed to the cost of the first Alarm System, we shared in the cost of purchasing a new organ for the parish. We have purchased new tables, chairs and the divider in the hall. We purchased a commercial fridge and offered funds to repair the stove.

To celebrate the 75th Anniversary of St. Joan of Arc Parish, we hosted a fashion show with the theme "The 1920's to the 1990's". When, we borrowed costumes from a Theatre Group that covered the span of 75 years.

One of our pastoral Associate's, Fr. Cunniffe, SCJ (RIP) asked the league to make baptismal stoles for the infants being baptized in the parish. This practice is continued today, thanks to our members.

Our official; CWL Banner is placed by the altar, and our Honour Guards are now present at a member's funeral. Our other banner is permanently hung in the hall

Every year, we hold a bazaar, and financially support our parish and neighbourhood charities. In 2007, the League presented the parish with \$10,000.00 towards the cost of our new kitchen.

We take part in Regional & Archdiocesan Days of Reflection, and we are well represented at the Archdiocesan Convention each year. We have had two Regional Chairs, some members went on the Regional executive and one member went on to the Archdiocesan Executive of the C.W.L.

Would you like to be a member? Active membership is open to Catholic women 16 years of age and up, upon payment of fees. Associate membership League .is open to Non Catholic women 16 years of age an up, upon payment of fees, with the exception of not having voting privileges.

Our council meets the 4th Monday of each month, September through May. Joining the League is a great way to make new friends and become more active in our parish.

May our Lady of Good Council watch over all of us!

St. Blaise Feast Day- February 3rd, Patron Saint of throat illnesses
The legend of his life that sprang up in the eighth century tell us that he was born in to a rich and noble family who raised him as a Christian. After becoming a bishop, a new persecution of Christians began. He received a message from God to go into the hills to escape persecution. Men hunting in the mountains discovered a cave surrounded by wild animals who were sick. Among them Blaise walked unafraid, curing them of their illnesses.

Recognizing Blaise as a bishop, they captured him to take him back for trial. On the way back, he talked a wolf into releasing a pig that belonged to a poor woman. When Blaise was sentenced to be starved to death, the woman, in gratitude, sneaked into the prison with food and candles. Finally Blaise was killed by the governor.

Blaise is the patron saint of wild animals because of his care for them and of those with throat maladies.

Saint Blaise, pray for us that we may not suffer from illnesses of the throat and pray that all who are suffering be healed by God's love. Amen
