

The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to all!

The Gospel this week presents to us the admonition of Jesus: Love your enemies, pray for those who persecute you. This posture is one that can only be grasped by people of faith. It can only be assumed by the strength of God's grace for us to do what we are empowered to do as sisters and brothers of Christ in our desire to follow His commands. It is unreasonable in the mind of the world to assume this disposition. It is indeed foolish unless we consider St. Paul's claims that the wisdom of this world as foolishness in the eyes of God. Love is the power of God that we are given in all circumstances to meet the many challenges of daily life. It is a gift that is ours if we are mindful of God's constant presence and accept it. Being mindful of God's grace and love in each situation that presents itself requires a practiced awareness and a life-long discipline. It begins the moment we decide to be disciples of Jesus. Discipleship is a disposition of listening to Jesus as we make choices to be patient in forbearing, the little slights that occur each day. It means looking for opportunities for extending our service, generosity and care. Some days it seems easier than others. Some days, it seems I fail miserably, but these are my opportunities to make new resolve to start over again. Starting over can happen at the moment I become aware of having fallen short of the disposition to be kind, patient and loving toward others or myself. Actually, I sometimes need to start over and sometimes more than once a day. Being mindful and aware of this makes it possible to ask for God's help and to act on the resolve to change and become more like Jesus. It is a struggle and it is engaging in this effort of listening to Jesus that we can realize the power of God's love and Grace in our lives and in the world. As we move toward the Lenten Season, it might be good for all of us to dispose ourselves to enter the holy season prepared to become better disciples of Jesus, ready to listen to his commandment to Love and to look for daily opportunities to practice it.

It has been a busy week here at St. Joan of Arc. We have been planning the Lenten retreats for our ministries. The schedule for this will be announced in the coming weeks. It is our hope to gather the ministry leaders and liturgical ministers once again during the Lenten season to bring the Parish Mission to clearer focus, to enhance the life and ministry of the parish. The plans for this retreat will be presented at the Parish Council Meeting on the first Monday in March when the date will be finalized. This week the monthly archdiocesan zone 5 meeting will be held at St Casmir's parish, no doubt we will be discussing the visitation processes that we and the surrounding parishes have experienced. No doubt this will bring new life and cooperation to the Church in our neighbourhood.

Tuesday Evening the Building and Grounds Committee met with many items on their agenda as they make progress to meet the practical needs of our parish. Heating, and cooling, doors, exit signs, storage space, meeting space, security issues repairs and enhancements all were discussed. This committee is tremendously active and dedicated to the ongoing improvement of our facilities and will be presenting updates to the parish as their progress unfolds. I am so grateful for the time talent and dedication that is put forward by the members of this committee.

Tuesday evening Sheila Malloch gathered the parents and Children preparing for first Eucharist in the Church and Parish hall to initiate their annual program for the spring. The parents and teachers of these children deserve our prayerful support and gratitude for the gift of faith and love they extend to their children. It was a joy to see the enthusiastic participation of these children and their parents throughout the building.

God is gracious to us in more ways that we can count, and I am grateful to all of you for the many ways you continue to grow the life of Christ throughout the parish. Thank you
