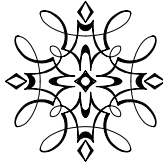

ASH WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 26

This is one of the two days in the church year (the other is Good Friday) when healthy persons between the ages of 18 and 59 are asked to observe a day of fasts and abstinence. This consists of having one full meal (with no meat) and up to two other meals which, taken together, do not equal a full meal; no snacks in between and no meat at any meal. We are asked to be sensible with regard to specific conditions. A construction worker, a person with diabetes or a nursing mother would not be expected to rigidly follow this precept. Observance of it is the church's way of helping us to be aware that we are entering a time of a more sombre preparation of our hearts for the full celebration of the Paschal Mystery at Easter. Abstinence on the other Fridays of Lent is a matter of personal, voluntary discipline, recommended by not required by the church precept. If we are not abstaining, we should be replacing it with some other personal discipline.
