## The Friar's Nook

As hopefully you would notice the church has begun its Lenten decor. It starts at an empty font where you can leave intentions during the season of Lent and will continue to grow toward the altar as we proceed through the season. You'll notice this year that each Sunday there is a picture placed on the sand. We begin Mass with a brief prayer regarding that picture. The theme is to remember all the forgotten people in the world, in Toronto, and in our lives and each week we will bring, at least in prayer, members of those groups. This week we are remembering those who are unhoused, otherwise known as homeless. We know how difficult the housing situation is in this area and how expensive it is. Hopefully we also know how wonderful it is to have a home and all the memories associated with it.

Our sign outside says, "All are welcome" and by remembering these people, whom we see sometimes but are invisible to us at other times, we make them part of the "All."

Pope Francis has said that "Even the most tragic and painful experiences risk not having a quiet place where they can be kept. Everything has to be exposed, shown off, fed to the gossip mill of the moment." He challenges us to not simply be concerned about the outward show but to take time this Lent to reflect on who we really are and what we are called to. "It means looking within ourselves and acknowledging our real identity, removing the masks we so often wear, slowing the frantic pace of our lives and embracing the truth of who we are."

If we are to be a reconciling community that welcomes all, as God does, then we can't be caught up in how things look to impress others. The Pope reminds us that we are to "love the brothers and sisters all around us, to be considerate to others, to feel compassion, to show mercy, to share all that we are and all that we have with those in need."

He urged all Christians to "return to the center of yourself," where "so many fears, feelings of guilt and sin are lurking. Precisely there the Lord has descended in order to heal and cleanse you," he said. "Let us enter into our inner chamber: There the Lord dwells, there our frailty is accepted, and we are loved unconditionally."

Let us strive to love all, as we are loved, and to look for the unseen all around us this Lent, Fr. ## <u>Creation Care: What is one way you can teach children the importance of care for creation?</u>

**Reflection excerpt:** 'On the care of creation, Catholic Young People in Kenya are not just talking the talk; they are walking the walk. They are planting trees by the thousands.... Consider the proverb popular in Kenya: "You must treat the earth well. It was not given to you by your parents. It is loaned to you by your children." Then teach a child the importance of the care of creation.'

**Suggested action:** Fast from overconsumption. Refrain from shopping one day a week. Use the money and time saved to pray, read, pursue a hobby, build relationships, or support your community.
