



THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

"Repent and believe in the gospel." Jesus gave this mandate after his forty days in the desert. This is seen in today's proclamation taken from among the first verses the gospel of Mark. This phrase also accompanied the imposition of ashes on our foreheads as we began our Lenten journey together on Ash Wednesday. Mark's gospel account is brief and short on details compared with those of Matthew and Luke and so perhaps we can more clearly focus on the meaning of what it is we are being told to do.

It is after 40 days of prayer and struggle in the desert that Jesus makes this clear proclamation, it compels us to listen: "Repent and believe in the gospel."

The Greek translation for repentance is *Metanoia*. This means to think differently or perhaps more accurately to have a profound change of heart and mind. In a word it is about conversion. Jesus calls us to conversion of life; that is to be transformed by faith in the good news. He has lived for us, died for us and rose from the dead to show us the way that is now prepared for all who believe in Him.

Conversion of heart involves active engagement in the life of Jesus Christ. It requires listening prayerfully to the word of God, the teachings of Jesus so we can learn what it means for each of us in daily life. Conversion then requires acting on the gospel word so that it can be more fully understood. To be converted and to believe are deeply connected parts in the process that Jesus calls us to realize more deeply through our Lenten journey. Repentance and belief in the gospel together are the process that takes us up the road to Jerusalem with Jesus. This process unites us with him in the story, and ultimately with Him on the Cross we encounter our own Salvation in Him.

Believing is becoming fully grounded in the truth of the gospel so the meaning of this good news is incorporated wholly in our own lives. We are to become united with God in whom we live and move and have our being. Jesus has become one with us in His life, death and resurrection; this is the gospel we are called to believe. We can only believe it if we are caught up in the struggle of repentance that the journey with Jesus provides.

Lent is the time when the Church throughout the world comes together to consciously enter the struggle so together we can truly celebrate the conversion and renewal of heart and mind that is brought to our faith in the gospel of Jesus Christ. As the weeks progress we will be called to engagement through the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We will share in the process of Christian Initiation of our new members as they prepare to celebrate the Easter sacraments for the first time. We ask the grace of the Holy Spirit to inspire us to follow more closely in the Way of that Jesus calls us to journey together through these 40 days. May God bring us to more deeply celebrate the paschal mysteries of Holy Week and Easter so we can more fully live the Gospel we are called to proclaim!
