

The Friar's Nook

Well, we've made it through one month of the year 2022, 11 more to go. We wait day by day or at least week by week to hear where we will be going with the COVID restrictions, but we haven't been idle. This past week I had a great meeting with a group of parishioners setting our sights on the post lockdown parish. Rather than waiting restrictions to be lifted and then starting to look at "how do we get going again", we decided to be proactive and plan what we would like to do and start getting things in place for it now. So, when the time comes, we will be ready to get up and running.

Once we have the plan in structure in place, then we will look at ways of implementing some of it now with the restrictions we have on us. I'm looking forward to what the future will bring for us as a parish and as a community.

Several of our committees and groups have been active during this time. With the wonder of Zoom meetings, we've been able to see and talk to one another and continue to move things forward. Since we have one more month to go before we start Lent, we're putting things in place now so that will be ready to celebrate as a parish and as individuals.

My hope right now is that we will be open and less restricted during Holy Week. It would be wonderful they celebrate the holiest days of the year together as a congregation. So, we will continue to watch and wait and have a "Plan B" ready just in case.

One of the things we are looking at as a parish, as a diocese, and as the Friars, is Pope Francis's called to a synod of synodality. Pope Francis is asking the church to open their ears to the voices of the laity who make up the church. As friars, we're having a meeting the first full week of March to do just that. We will be listening to those who work in all of our ministries to hear from them what we hope to accomplish in the future and how we can do that. The archdiocese has a survey online to get responses from the laity. This is not just for the average churchgoer, but I think it's especially important for those who no longer go to church to contribute to this information. If the church is going to be relevant in the future, we need to hear what we are missing in the present. I see this as an offshoot of the second Vatican council and I'm excited about it as when Vatican 2 occurred, I was a young child but now the changes of Vatican 2 are being realized in the lives of people in the church. During Lent, I will be encouraging people to go online and to fill out the questionnaire, but I'll be especially encouraging people to talk to their non-churched friends and family to do the same that we may be the church for all people - a church where all are welcome.

In the meanwhile, I would ask you to think about what you would like to do in the parish. When we reopen fully, we will need lots of people to revitalize our ministries. And hopefully there will be new ministries to begin. Take the time now to ask "What is God calling me to" at this moment in time in our church and in our world so that together we can face this task and the challenges that lie ahead with God's guidance and God strength.
