The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to All!

This Sunday, in ordinary time invites us to consider the vocations given us to follow Jesus into the deeper water of hope in the guidance He gives to all disciples to put our trust in Him. This is suggested in the gospel instruction he gives as to Peter and the other fishermen he has called, to cast their nets into the deep water. There they receive the unexpected catch of more fish than they can handle. Jesus brings a surprise into their immediate experience as He does to ours when we follow His guidance. In a time when the vocations of married life, religious life and priesthood, continue to be a fundamental value to us as a Church, we can sometimes wonder if our efforts to promote these values in todays world is worth the effort. Will it produce what we need for sustenance? Jesus invites the disciples to cast their nets into the deep water and they do because he tells them to do so. It pays off beyond measure. For us to be attentive to the word of God, and to step prayerfully into the deep water of faith is what we need to do, trusting that God has a plan for us that is beyond our knowledge and expectations. On this week when we celebrate Marriage Sunday throughout the Archdiocese and we conclude the Jubilee year of Consecrated Religious Life, we are given pause to listen most deeply to the gospel message, to embark on a deeper search for fulfillment in the life of commitment to profound relationship with the Lord through the Sacraments of Matrimony, and Priestly Ordination and the Vowed life to the Church in religious vocations. We are called to step more deeply into our life commitments to the Lord in whatever state of life we are chosen to fulfill.

As a Parish, we are deeply committed to becoming a community dedicated to discerning the presence of God in our midst and seeking to know and do his will. This is how we may live and proclaim the Gospel to all, welcoming new disciples to hear the Good News and celebrate the love and reconciliation we have come to know in Christ Jesus our Lord. All are welcome!

This week we welcome Ana Da Costa, OFS, our new director of Religious Ed. and Stewardship coordinator. Ana is a third order Franciscan whose life and dedication to the Church was recognized by the Ministries Committee with great enthusiasm as she was invited to become a pastoral associate for the parish. I am delighted to have such a professional and creative person whose presence and giftedness will bring new life and ideas to enhance the wonderful participation of so many dedicated volunteers who steward their gifts of life, talent time and treasure to make our parish a vibrant place of worship and service to the Lord. Ana will work with us as Friars of the Atonement to enhance the Franciscan spirit of hospitality and service that this parish so generously demonstrates.

This Wednesday, is Ash Wednesday. Together we will begin our annual walk with the Lord in our Lenten journey to prepare us to celebrate the Passion Death and Resurrection of the Lord in the Pascal Mystery we celebrate at Easter. We ask the Holy Spirit to guide us as Jesus was guided through the desert that we may grow in faith hope and love throughout this holy time and so celebrate ever more fruitfully these mysteries of the redemption he won for us through the Cross and Resurrection. Ash Wednesday February 10, 2016

This is one of the two days in the church year (the other is Good Friday) when healthy persons between the ages of 18 and 59 are asked to observe a day of fast and abstinence. This consists of having one full meal (with no meat) and up to two other meals which, taken together, do not equal the full meal; no snacks in between and no meat at any meal. We are asked to be sensible with regard to specific conditions. A construction worker, a person with diabetes or a nursing mother would not be expected to rigidly follow this precept. Observance of it is the church's way of helping us to be aware that we are entering a time of a more sombre preparation of our hearts for the full celebration of the Paschal Mystery at Easter. Abstinence on the other Fridays of Lent is a matter of personal, voluntary discipline, recommended but not required by church precept. If we are not abstaining, we should be replacing it with some other personal discipline.
