THE FRIAR'S NOOK

God has a sense of humour. For those of you who are at my Masses last week, I talked about running headlong into a concrete beam, but I was okay. Apparently hitting the front of my head wasn't a problem. This week I fell and hit the back of my head have ended up in the emergency room for over 5 hours only to find by that I had a concussion. It's tough when your brain doesn't work as well as you would like it to. So, if this column seems to wander blame it on my brain. I fell while hanging shelves in the storage room. As many of you know, I've been cleaning up the rectory and the church meeting and storage rooms. It's kind of like an early spring cleaning. It's amazing the things that I have found just stuck in a room or stuck in a closet and it got me thinking about how much stuff we hold on to. If you have ever had to clean up after someone has died, then you know how big a task it is to get rid of all their stuff.

When my grandmother died, my father had us over the 1st Sunday of the month to go through her things and get rid of stuff. The second Sunday of the month, we went back I noticed many of the things we had already gotten rid of we're back! I realised that my father was picking through the trash and reclaiming many of his mother's things. So, I told my nieces and nephews to take whatever they could take [even if they didn't want it] and they could bring toss it in my dumpster and get rid of it once and for all.

But we hold on to more than "things" often times we hold on to feelings and memories. These can be fine if they are positive and upbuilding, but so often we find ourselves holding on to negative feelings and bad memories. This doesn't help us at all in our growth and our following of Jesus and in our loving. I've often had people tell me how difficult it is to let go of these things - perhaps more difficult than to let go of material things. But it's these things that get in our way as we seek to follow the Lord and be good stewards. Would that be so easy to do with our feelings and memories. They keep coming back and we keep needing to get rid of them. But we're not alone in this, Christ himself is here to guide and strengthen and heal. As we look at our lives, and take stock of the things we need to get rid of - both spiritual and physical - we need to rely on the wisdom and guidance of Jesus who will help us even if we keep fishing it out of the trash!

Let us take stock of our lives and see what we need to hold on to to follow Jesus and to be better stewards.
