#### The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to all!

We are back in Ordinary Time for the next month before Lent begins this year on February 10. Ash Wednesday is early because Easter will be celebrated at the end of March. The Rite of Christian Initiation, RCIA program has resumed and we will begin the more intensive aspect of this program as we approach the Lenten Easter Season, so please keep the candidates for the Easter Sacraments in your prayers in these coming weeks. As January progresses, I will be working with the Ministries Committee as we begin the interviewing process to hire a new director of religious education/stewardship coordinator. We are grateful to have good candidates for this position, and are hopeful that we will have a person in place as we begin the Lenten season.

This week the gospel tells the story of Jesus at the Wedding Feast of Cana, where he turns water into wine. This story is one that helps us to contemplate the wonderful sacraments of Eucharist and Matrimony in the context of Jesus's first public miracle performed by the request of his Mother who is concerned about the couple whose wedding party has run out of wine. Jesus in his tender compassion meets his mother's request. This first miracle points to an even greater one at the end of His life. It is one thing to turn water into wine, but in the continuation of the life and passion of the Lord, wine will be used at the Last Supper to celebrate the first Eucharist where bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, a perpetual remembrance of his death and resurrection to be celebrated liturgically throughout the ages, as the source and summit of our worship in the mystery of faith as we proclaim his death and resurrection.

The marriage at which Jesus first performed the miracle is one that beautifully illustrates a connection between Eucharist and Matrimony. Jesus tells us that there is no greater love than to lay down our life for another. He demonstrates this love on the Cross. He is the Word of God made flesh in the sacrifice he realizes as he lays down his life for us all. In Matrimony, as a man and woman exchange their vows they speak the words of enduring love that become enfleshed in their love for one another lived out each day as they lay down their life for one another, for the rest of their lives. The Word of their Vows becomes enfleshed in their love for one another in a way that makes it possible for their children to experience this love as it is communicated in the sacrifices that are a part of the living Christian witness that Matrimony makes possible. When a couple celebrates the sacrament of Matrimony in the Church, they invite Jesus, the Word Made Flesh to become the ground of their relationship as mystically, the two become one flesh. Eucharist, the sacrament of unity, is perfectly complimented by the sacrament of Matrimony. Jesus present at the Wedding Feast of Cana met the needs of the couple who had run out of wine. Jesus present at the Sacrament of Matrimony in the Church provides the precious Body and Blood of Christ to become the source of life and strength to the marriage. Every Sunday we celebrate the Word made flesh in Christ in the Eucharist. In the sacrament of Matrimony, the Eucharist is realized in a unique and wonderful way of witness for the Church and for each family that is blessed by the sacramental presence of Christ at the center of family life. Let us pray for all who are called to this wonderful sacrament that is the foundation of Christian family life and a fundamental witness to the gospel. (continued on the next page)

In these times, it is good to contemplate the extraordinary grace that the Church receives from the love of devoted couples whose devotion is so deeply blessed by their witness in Christian marriage. May God bless our families richly in the precious Blood of Christ that is the source of unity and grace.
