THE PASTOR'S CORNER Peace and Goodness to all!

Today we celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This important time was established in 1909 by Servant of God, Fr. Paul Wattson, SA the founder of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement, and it is celebrated throughout the world by Christians of every denomination to realize the prayer of Jesus who prayed, "That all may be one, so the world may believe". Here at St Joan of Arc we will be presenting the Annual Student Essay award that is sponsored by the Archdiocese of Toronto and the Atonement Friars at the 10:00 AM Mass. Fr. Timothy MacDonald SA, the Director of the Archdiocesan Office of Ecumenical and Interfaith Affairs will present the award.

This week we also remember the Sisters of Sion who will celebrate 175 years since their foundation that was established to further the relationship between Christians and Jews. It is a holy time of celebration and prayer for all who pray and work for the reconciliation of all of God's people as Children of God.

This past week, I attended the veneration of the relic of St. Francis Xavier that was presented at St. Michael's Cathedral.
