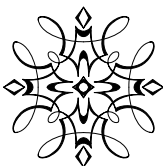

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

It was good to have Bishop Mc Grattan here with us to celebrate our masses on his pastoral visitation. This process involved the preparation of our parish vitality report and the gathering of all of the representatives of our various ministries and parish organizations to report on our progress and development of the parish council structures that we have been working to create over the past two years. In what amounted to our semi-annual gathering of the general meeting or as we call it our mini AGM, we were able to demonstrate the ways and means of our parish stewardship as it continues on a regular basis. Fr. Timothy MacDonald, SA, the Vicar General of the Friars of the Atonement was also present for the General Meeting and so he too was able to see the outlay of our parish structures as they function on a regular basis. We also demonstrated how our series of parish retreats has brought the spiritual dimension of our Parish Mission as the primary driver for all of our parish ministries and activities. The Bishop made it clear that he was deeply impressed by our processes and said that if he had to give a grade on our parish it would have to be somewhere between an A and an A+. Well done good and humble servants of the Lord in St. Joan of Arc Parish. Your dedication and ongoing stewardship of the parish and its ministries was beautifully demonstrated to those who came from outside to see how we operate.

Much thanks goes to Cathi Richardson whose efforts to re-invigorate our organizations and coordinate the Stewardship and Screening processes brought us to where we need to be before the visitation process even began. Rosanne Kelly was able to present all of our sacramental records and financial records to Deacon Michael as he examined these. The data furnished by the finance committee and especially Joanne Oswald as well as the great work of Mary Collins over the past couple of years made Michael's task simple. Thank you to all of you for your ongoing work and commitment to these tasks. Sheila Malloch, presented the programs we provide for the education of Children, as these are facilitated by the many volunteers she engages for this important ministry. We are grateful for her care and dedication to the spiritual development and sacramental preparation for the children and their families. Mary Jago demonstrated the vitality of our RCIA program, and we celebrated a special blessing conferred by the Bishop on the 16 people who are enrolled in our RCIA and RCIC programs at the Noon Mass on Sunday. All of the Stewardship group leaders presented very clear messages regarding the groups they lead and we are grateful to all of you who did this. Rose DiTommaso deserves honourable mention for her leadership in so many of the groups that reported.

The documentation of the life and work that we do in the parish is a mere reflection of our ongoing life and vitality. It was a real team effort to bring the data together in a clear and coherent report that was augmented by the presentations that were given. Larry and Cyndi O'Grady produced an updated chart of our parish structures to make the presentation clear in focus. Thanks to them for all the great work they do. Cyndi also bakes terrific bread, which we broke at the dinner on Friday Evening with the Bishop and parish leaders.

Much thanks to all of the members of our parish organizations. Without the ongoing dedicated participation of all of you, and the great leadership that is demonstrated by our coordinators, the life and work of the parish would not happen in a way that was made clearly demonstrable for the visitation. This was not a "dog and pony show" to present an image of the parish, it was a clear reflection of the ongoing life and ministry that happens every day here at St. Joan of Arc Parish. How can I as pastor thank you enough for the service you provide to God's people who come to St. Joan of Arc to meet the Lord and be welcomed to his House.

The bishop remarked that the extent and quality of service that is provided by our parish volunteers and ministers would have a community benefit value that would probably exceed \$250,000.00 to our annual operating budget. I thought about this and realized that no dollar amount could ever meet the priceless character of the love and dedication that our parish stewards provide in service to the people of St. Joan of Arc Parish.

Thank you to all of you who participated in this visitation process. Thank you to all of our parishioners! It is all of us who make St. Joan of Arc a house of prayer and fellowship for all!

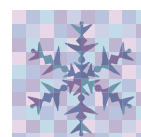
