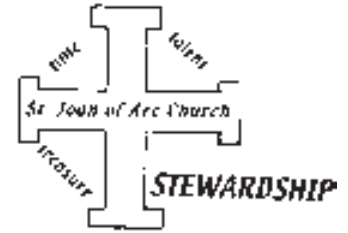

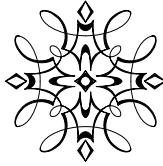

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

May the Peace and Joy of Christ be in your heart today and always.

It has been a busy month here at St. Joan of Arc. Our organizations and activities have continued in spite of the spatial constraints the building project has created and I want to thank everyone for their patience and peace in the necessary adjustments that we all have been making.

We came to the end of our fiscal year, and the diocesan reports are prepared and already sent in. A special thanks to Joanne Oswald for her work on these documents. The finance committee met last week to draft its annual report for the parish. This will be completed after our next meeting in February. It will be presented in digest form in the beginning of March for discussion at the parish council meeting. I want to thank all of the members of this committee who work so diligently and offer such clear and practical advice to direct us in the wise financial management of the parish. Beginning in February we will post the monthly income for the current year along with that of last year so we can see the growth that is occurring on a regular basis.

The committee is also working on creating a budget to help us see the directions to take for growing our parish ministries for the future. The finance committee monitors the patterns of our income and expenses both for the ongoing life of the parish and the building project as it continues. There is close cooperation between the finance committee and the building committee with shared membership on these committees as well as the Capital Fund Project committee.

The Building Committee met this past Tuesday to go over the progress of the building project. It was made evident that although changes have had to be made because of discoveries that turned up in the project, that we are still on track to come in on budget with the projects. The hall and kitchen project should be completed toward the end of February. The outside work will not be completed until the spring. Many of you know that when the stairs were removed that it was discovered that the foundation under the retaining walls and planters along Bloor Street had deteriorated over the years, and investigations were then made to assure us that the foundation under the Church and its towers were secure. Thank God these foundations are secure and will not need major repair. The retaining walls along the parking lot required redesign and this required some shifting of funds to make sure we stayed on budget to complete the project. We are confident that you will enjoy the final outcome when it is complete.

One other major topic we discussed was the fact that work on the project has revealed the necessity to do some major electrical work in the Church, Friary and Hall. The issues we have had with the telephone system, and the new boiler surfaced because of the antiquated electrical system. This will need to be remedied in the near future. We are currently engaged in the studies to see what the costs will be and how long it will take to resolve it. While it will not impinge on the current building project, except it will require that we delay the updated lighting in the sanctuary area. We will hold the portion of the Capital Campaign Funds for this lighting in abeyance until the Electrical Maintenance work is completed.

As soon as we have completed the studies on what needs to be done, and what will be involved, I will inform the parish of our next steps. Please pray with me that this may soon be resolved. Our Building Committee and finance committees are working together to create a Building Maintenance fund to deal with this issue and to see that an ongoing program for building maintenance is sustained so that our facilities will remain in good working order for the future.

Thank you once again for your patience and generosity in these matters.
