The Friar's Nook

(The office did not receive in time for the Christmas Bulletin. So here it is just a few weeks late.)

I'd like to share with you of little Christmas story,

Sonya died of cancer this summer. In the fall I asked the students at Marrocco Merton high school, who were looking for her at Mass, if they would pray that God sends me the right dog for Christmas. I also had Mass for the first time with the students of Saint Luigi's school. They invited me over to do Mass and asked if I would bring my special dog that they had heard about. Sadly, I had to break it to them that she had passed away, but I asked them also to pray that God sends me the right dog for Christmas.

As you are aware, I've had a lot of traveling this fall for the Friars, but knew that would finish by Christmas time. Last month, I Googled "dogs available for adoption near me". As I was looking down the page I noticed a cute dog with a peculiar name – Kalamata! I clicked on her picture, the only dog I clicked on, and read that she was from Cairo, Egypt. That explained her name, but as I read further, I noticed something else. She was a stray and as a two-month-old puppy was hit by a bus. This crushed the toes on her front left paw, so they had to be amputated. As I read on, I saw that her leg was broken in two places and while they tried to heal her leg, she spent months in a kennel and wasn't healing so they had to amputate. At that point I looked up to heaven and asked God if this was a sign that she was the right dog since I wasn't looking for another three-legged dog!

It seems to me that this was a sign that she and I were supposed to get together. She has had her entire left leg removed so she's not a candidate for getting a prosthetic like Sonya was but since she was without a leg for most of her life she's adapted quite well. I'm not sure how well she will adapt to being the parish puppy but I'm willing to work with her. When I went to meet her, she was quite shy but when her foster mom called to her, she came running to me – twice! She said that was a good sign that I was the person for her.

She's only a little over a year old so she has a lot of energy. I will do my best to channel that energy into productive learning. (And maybe a little more exercise for me!)

As I said in the beginning, I will leave it up to you to decide whether this is a Christmas miracle or not. I wasn't visited by 3 ghosts, and I didn't change my feelings about Christmas, but I do believe in the power of prayer, and I trust that the high school and elementary school children praying for me was heard. I even asked Sonya that if this was the right dog that she help me out. The very next day I heard from the adoption agency that I had been waiting to hear from for weeks.

I look forward to introducing Kali (Kalamata is too formal) to the parish and I hope that she becomes an asset, keeping children's attention and drawing others to come to church.


