THE PASTOR'S CORNER Peace and Goodness to all!

As the church is slowly getting back to our regular practice, we have had requests from those who are awaiting sacraments, especially baptism and first communion. As they are willing to come to Mass, it is encouraging especially in this time to see new life in the church and growth in that life. So, in the next few weeks, you'll be able to witness sacraments of initiation at the 10:00 o'clock mass. To me, it's a delight for two reasons. First it shows that we are beginning to get back to some normalcy in our church life, and secondly it shows us that, even in the midst of trial and tribulation, life in God goes on and we can celebrate it!

I wish to thank all of you who have continued to contribute to the upkeep and maintenance of our church during these times. But it has come to my attention That the money for outreach, specifically Saint Vincent DePaul and the Winter Welcome Table are greatly diminished. I realize that it may be difficult to be thinking of winter during these blazing days of July, but we only have \$100 in our account for the Winter Welcome Table and as you know that's not going to make for much food for even one week! The church's shut down due to Corona virus happened over a time when we would normally have had fundraisers for Saint Vincent DePaul and for the Winter Welcome Table. But seeing as we were closed then, they didn't happen. As you really must realize the need is still no less, and in fact in some cases is even greater. I know that this shut down has affected many of you in regards to work but for those who can afford to I'd ask you to consider contributing to this outreach so we can help those who are even less fortunate than we are.

I am trying to do my part. I wrote a letter to the Canadian singer Ann Murray. As some of you know she performed a concert in our church when it was new that was broadcast on the CBC. After plying her with great praise, I asked about reprising this concert, one for our 100th anniversary and two as a fundraiser during this time of Covid. You might think I'm crazy, (you probably already do), but nothing ventured-nothing gained. When I was in high school, they said I was crazy to invite President Jimmy Carter to speak to our school. But I did anyway, and he came! I guess I'm an eternal optimist. However, this letter didn't turn out as favorably well I got thanks for the invitation I was informed that she has retired from any public performances and so would not be able to do it. If any of you have any wacky ideas like mine for raising funds by all means let me know!

I continue to ask for your patience during these times. Yes, we have a lot of rules, but they're all in place to keep everyone safe. Last weekend I got yelled at for not letting people into the church 5 to 10 minutes after Mass had begun. Since there is no obligation to attend Sunday Mass during the pandemic, if you want to attend you need to arrive early.

I thank you for putting up with me, and trust that I'm doing the best I can for you and the church.

A Message from the Cardinal Collins

I want to thank all of you for your co-operation and kindness as we have returned to church over these past weeks. It has been so great to see parishioners once again and I thank everyone who has been so helpful in this re-opening stage, especially our wonderful volunteers. Thank you! As you may have heard in recent days, a new by-law has been passed that makes the use of masks or face coverings inside all public places mandatory. This includes churches and our own parish. I would ask that all those coming to church bring a mask or face covering and wear it upon entering the church. I recognize that this may be an inconvenience, yet I know that we are all committed to caring for our neighbour and those around us. While a number of restrictions have been lifted in recent days, we are still in the middle of a pandemic and need to take the appropriate steps to minimize any potential spread of Covid-19. So, while the Archdiocese of Toronto had highly recommended wearing a mask while in church and I know that most of you have been doing so, it is now a by-law that we must follow. Thank you in advance for your co-operation as we do all that we can to take care of one another and keep our community safe and healthy.
