

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to you and yours.

Last week we began to consider the Spirit of Stewardship in Christ that is the foundation of our Parish organization. Today I would like to talk about the most important aspects of Stewardship for the parish ministry.

The source and summit of our Parish Life is the Holy Eucharist. The Sunday celebration of the Word of God and the Sacrament in the liturgy, commemorates the death and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ who is the cornerstone of the Church, the Body of Christ. He is the head and we are the members. Our Sunday liturgies gather us together to remember who we are and whose we are in Christ. This gathering and celebration is made possible through the ministry of the priest and ministers who come together to proclaim the Word and administer the Sacrament for the community. Hence the ministries of the parish that support this celebration are paramount expressions of our Stewardship of the Sacred Mission and Ministry of Christ that is realized in our Sunday worship.

Here at St. Joan of Arc, these ministries include Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Servers, Sacristans, Greeters, Ushers, Music Ministers, and Priests. Together these ministries play a real function and symbolic role that represents the Body of Christ in our worship and in our world. There are many gifts as St. Paul tells us that are poured out by the Holy Spirit on the whole body of Christ. It is in recognizing these gifts, and calling them forward for the service of the Community that we realize the work of God in our midst. We do this through the various ministries that are represented and realized in our worship services. The priest is the Presider at liturgy who orchestrates the services of all the various ministries so that the fullness of our life and prayer is realized in the worship that inspires all that we are and do in our Christian lives.

Each ministry represents the life and work of all of our parishioners who gather weekly to hear the word of God and become refreshed and renewed so that we can return to our families, places of employment, and life activities as ambassadors of the Good News we have heard in God's Word. We go forth from worship, fed on the Sacrament of the life of Christ that strengthens us by God's love to be of service to the whole community. Indeed ministry of our sacramental life is the paramount service for the Stewardship for our Parish.

To be called to serve in any one of our ministries is indeed a vocation for service to the Christian Community and it is our hope that each of you will pray and ask God to send labourers into the field for the harvest of our Parish Community. If you have a desire to serve in any of our parish ministries, please come forward to prepare for this through our various programs of ministry training. Please contact the parish office and we will be sure the leaders of each ministry will advise you of their program schedules for the fall season.

Thank you to all who serve in these liturgical ministries and welcome to all who wish to step into these services. God has blessed our parish with many generous ministers, and we are seeking to increase our numbers in the coming year. Individuals often sign up to participate in the particular service that they most often attend, and with 5 different liturgical celebrations every weekend, there is always a place for more. May God Bless you, in your discernment. Please consider stepping forward for these important and sacred ministries of service to your parish.
