The race itself begins at 7:00 AM with a massive start in Mirror Lake, where close to 3000 will begin the 4.4 k swim, followed by the 180 k bicycle through the mountains followed by the 42.2 K marathon. Please accept my heartfelt thanks for your prayerful support and your donations to the Iron Friar campaign for the new Church Signs. Your support is what sustains everything that I can do.

This week, Cathi Richardson and I met to talk about our plans for stewardship weekend and the various priorities for the coming year. Our efforts to welcome people, communicate the Gospel and gather at the table of the Lord are all important parts of the parish mission that unite all of our parish organizations as we continue as Stewards of our Gifts. Having the proper tools to do the work that God gives us will make our work more effective and our outreach to all, better served. Please pray that God will bless the work of our hearts and hands.

This week we welcome the visiting priests who are here to serve the community. I know they will be welcomed by the warmth and love of all. I am grateful for their presence and service during these few days of my absence.
