

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and Goodness to all!

The power of prayer is demonstrated in our Sunday readings this week, beginning with the bargaining of Abraham with God for mercy to be shown to the people of Sodom. The desire for mercy is within Abraham's heart and his relationship with God grows as he comes to know God's mercy in the answer to his prayer. Jesus in the gospel teaches his disciples to pray in the model prayer to Our Father in heaven. He then goes on to help us all to understand the importance of perseverance in prayer with the very human story of a friend asking another for a favor with great persistence. Constancy in prayer is the way to grow in our knowledge and relationship with God who sends the Holy Spirit to all who ask Him.

Prayer leads us to know the Spirit of God "in whom we live and move and have our being" as one who is closer to us than we are to ourselves. This Holy Spirit prepares our hearts in prayer to be a dwelling place for God. The familiar prayers we say in the psalms or the rosary or even at mass are formed by the Word of God that has been given to us through the scriptures and traditions of the Church. These teach us to pray from our hearts, as the Spirit teaches us to cry out "Abba, Father" as St. Paul says in the same tradition Jesus demonstrated in the scriptures.

Learning to pray always and never loosing heart involves a lifetime of practice that leads us to grow closer to God in all of our life circumstances. God is always with us and prayer makes it possible to know this truth so we can live in peace through all our experiences. It is not an easy process because it involves every facet of our lives and there are some rough situations; the challenges of our sinfulness, and the struggle of human relationships that can take us to the end of our rope. "Hang on and don't lose your sense of humor" a wise spiritual director once said to me when I was going through a particularly difficult time, yet others had said, "Let go and let God". So which should I do? "That's your choice" he said, "pray about it." This made me laugh in its irony, but it wasn't an easy time. Even when it's impossible to see the light in the tunnel, God is with us, and sometimes only faith nurtured by prayer can know this. As we look back on trials and troubles that we have passed through, it is possible to see that God has been faithful to us as to Jesus whose passion and death were punctuated by prayer. Ultimately, he let go in the prayer: "into your hands I commend my soul. 11.5


