



THE PASTOR'S CORNER

With Canada Day weekend upon us, summer is in full swing, schools are closed and vacation activities are planned and underway. It is a blessing to have a time when things slow down to give us leisure, rest and the opportunity to appreciate life itself as the gift of God in which all of our lives activities occur.

In the hustle bustle of schedules plans and obligations we often cannot be fully conscious of this gift because our attention is occupied in the things we're doing. Having some free space in our lives is essential to contemplation and an awareness of the bigger picture into which life obligations, duties and activities fit.

Free leisure time is essential to prayer; that is opening our hearts, minds and lives in conscious attention to God who is the giver of all life.

Unfortunately this gift is diminished in our world whose mentality tells us time is money, and productivity is the essential value for all wealth.

Unfortunately we can often buy into this mentality as the deepest truth.

Computers, televisions, electric gadgets, games and media devices can sometimes so crowd our leisure time, that essentially it is lost to the distractions and entertainments that are unwittingly brought to us by these things. Hence quality leisure can get lost even as we spend time having fun with them.

I am reading a good book. It's called "the Bridge of Sighs". It is the story of a family. It is slow moving and Richard Russo, the author draws good characters whose flawed humanity makes them seem real. The time it takes me to read and reflect on these persons also makes me think of others and myself in my real life relationships. This helps me to appreciate my life in a wider perspective. It even helps me to pray to God, remembering who is the source of all life, and that God is love. I often think how perhaps Christian love and being at Church might enhance the thoughts and lives of those who pass through my mind as I read.

Contemplating love in our relationships, forgiveness, generosity, hope, reconciliation, needed outreach and benefits happens when we give ourselves the time and space to consider the particular relationships we have and what others require in our lives. Reading a good book is one way to do this. There are so many others, but they all require thoughtful, contemplative open time.

How we do this differs with everyone. Perhaps for you, it is being alongside a large expanse of water, or walking through a forest, or gazing up at the stars or engaging in a long friendly conversation. For another it is taking a drive or bike or a boat ride. Perhaps it is just stopping to think of loved ones present or past and praying for their well being. One thing, however, is always necessary to the process, that is free time; leisure.

Jesus in his busy ministry spent long periods in prayer and contemplation. He took long walks with his disciples. It is my prayer for each and all of us, is that we will find or make time this summer to be at leisure for the Lord, and for ourselves, and loved ones. Let's make an effort to fully appreciate the gift of life and the meaning of our loving relationships with God and those who are dear to us this summer. This summer pace is precious time that reminds us that it is our real life.
