The Friar's Nook

Coming out of COVID we have been trying to rebuild our parish community in one of the most important things is the commitment of parishioners. I am so grateful for the number of parishioners we have that are committed to the life and well-being of this community, but I realize it's only a small percent of parish members.

I know that everyone has lots of commitments in their lives and the thought of adding one more might seem overwhelming but a commitment to the parish is genuinely a life-giving experience. It connects us in faith with those who we worship with so that we are no longer strangers in the community the brothers and sisters.

At one of my General Council meetings at Graymoor, I came upon this inspirational quote from Johann Wolfgang von Goethe who was a German poet, playwright, novelist, scientist, statesman, theatre director, and critic. Since he is a writer, and I am not I would like to share his words with you about commitment.

"Until One Is Committed: Until one is committed, there is hesitancy, the chance to draw back, always ineffectiveness.

Concerning all acts of initiative and creation there is one elementary truth, the ignorance of which kills countless ideas and splendid plans: that the moment one definitely commits oneself, then Providence moves too.

All sorts of things occur to help one that would never otherwise have occurred. A whole stream of events issues from the decision, raising in one's favor all manner of unforeseen incidents and meetings and material assistance, which no man could have dreamed would have come his way.

Whatever you can do, or dream you can do, begin it. Boldness has genius and power and magic in it."

These words speak to me as I have lived my life, especially in the Church! Making a decision, a choice, a commitment, comes with the power of the Holy Spirit to be about the work of God in my life. It also come with the energy and strength needed to accomplish great things since it is the work of God and not mine.

Making a commitment to the parish is not a burden but a grace that guides me along God's way for me. I encourage you to look to this for yourselves. We are freed and enlivened when we do the will of God in our lives. Even if it is not what we expect!


