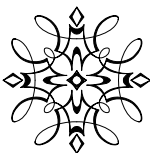

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

PEACE AND GOODNESS TO ALL!

Today on the feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Whole Church throughout the world and we ask that God continue to grow the many gifts that we are called to share in building our parish to be a sign of the Kingdom of God. This feast ends the 50 days of Easter celebration and so this coming week we will enter the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. At the 10:00 mass of Pentecost we will celebrate two infant baptisms and the reception of *Margo Whitfield* into full communion with the Catholic Church. She will receive the sacrament of Confirmation, as did the other members of the RCIA community at the Easter Vigil. Margo was in China at Easter time and so was unable to be here to receive the sacraments with the others. So on this last day of the Easter Season she will be joined by the others from the RCIA group and the parishioners to rejoice in her reception. This week the RCIA program will be suspended until we begin again in September. Already we have heard from individuals who are interested in beginning the process next season, and so if you or any adults or children you know are interested in being baptized or becoming a Roman Catholic, please contact me so that you can be contacted in the autumn when we re-convene.

The photo album and parish directory is in process. We thank all of you who had your pictures taken for the album, and we apologize for those who were unable to have their pictures taken on Saturday because of the time limits. There will be another opportunity in early October following Stewardship Weekend when we hope to complete this process and have a robust representation of photographs for our parish for the album. If you have a photo of yourself or your family which you would like to submit instead of having the company take the pictures, please send them to me or Cathi Richardson by E-mail or bring them in so we can scan the picture to have them placed in the album. We can also take an informal picture of you or your family to submit, so please let us know what your preference is and we will try to accommodate your preference. The group pictures of our various organizations and committees will be taken by Larry O'Grady on September 21, before the parish AGM (Annual General Meeting). These will be assembled and arranged for the album over the summer months. Pray with us that this will be a very successful effort.

This week we celebrated a Mass of Thanksgiving to mark the end of the School year mass for Marrocco Merton High School. It is always a joy to have this community gather at St. Joan of Arc Church, and we look forward to their return in the Fall semester. Please continue to pray for our youth. It is our hope to be able to develop a youth ministry in the coming year. With the grace of God we hope to serve this important segment of our community.

St. Joan of Arc hosted the priests and staff of the parishes of Zone 5 for their monthly meeting. A word of thanksgiving to Rose DiTommaso and Dominic and Maria Caprara for their assistance in providing a wonderful picnic luncheon meal for this occasion, what a wonderful blessing they are to me and the parish community.

In the next couple of weeks we will be developing the parish calendar for next year. Our staff meeting on June 15th will be dedicated to this purpose. Please submit any dates we should know about to the parish office so we can set your space and time necessities in our planning.

We will continue to celebrate Baptisms throughout the summer months, so if you wish you have a child baptized please telephone Sheila Malloch this week, there will only be one or two preparation classes available before she leaves for the summer. Should extraordinary circumstances arise, please contact me at my extension.

The Holy Spirit is poured out in abundance in our parish and upon each of us and we are grateful for the help and inspiration we are incessantly given. On this feast of Pentecost, we give thanks to God for the guidance and help we are given each day and we pray that we may continue to serve God and the people who come to us to encounter the Lord Jesus Christ in our midst.

May God continue to bless you all with the Love and Joy that is promised through Christ our Redeemer and Lord.

A message from The Most Rev. John Boissonneau :

A New translation of the Roman Missal

The way Catholics celebrate the Eucharist follows a standard form. We call this the Order of Mass. It is comprised of 4 main parts: The Introductory Rites, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of the Eucharist and the Concluding Rites. Our worship is one great dialogue, namely, that God speaks to us and we speak to God. This is reflect in the many prayers and responses spoken by the priest and the people. Our prayers are not spontaneous, but have been given to us from many sources through the generations. They are collected together in the Sacramentary or Roman Missal. Each prayer text conveys aspects of the great mystery of faith that we celebrate.

In 2000, Blessed John Paul II issued a 3rd Edition of the Roman Missal based on the renewal the sacred liturgy called for by the bishops during the Second Vatican Council. Originally produced in Latin, the texts have been translated into English using a careful method to preserve, as much as possible, the full meaning of the text. On the first Sunday of Advent 2011, we will begin to use this new translation of the Roman Missal. The prayers and acclamations will sound different from the ones we now employ. Therefore, we need to learn the revised translations of the parts of the mass. In September, we will begin to introduce these new translations. Further reflection on the parts of the Mass and the meaning of the texts will occur from January to June 2012. For more information, please go to:
