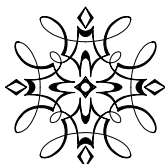
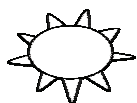

The Pastor's Corner
Peace and Goodness to All!

In this Year of Mercy declared by Pope Francis, we are all invited to reflect on the meaning of mercy as it is demonstrated by the life, teaching and work of Jesus as it is demonstrated in the gospel. Luke's gospel is perhaps the one that most clearly reflects the mercy of God poured out in the Love of Jesus. This week we remember the story of the woman who generously anointed Jesus feet in the home of the Pharisee. The Pharisee who had failed to perform the common courtesy that was expected of a host at this time imposed false judgment upon the generous actions performed by the woman. "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what kind of woman this is who is touching him—that she is a sinner." Jesus uses the opportunity to awaken the Pharisee to the Judgments he has imposed upon Him for his merciful appreciation of the anointing he has received from this woman. Jesus does this by proposing a compelling story that presents degrees of forgiveness that are delivered to draw conclusions about justice and forgiveness that had not occurred in the mind of the Pharisee. The story ends with the obvious indictment of the Pharisee's judgment against Jesus as being false and misguided. The proposal Jesus makes invites the Pharisee to think more deeply than his own thoughts can fathom to understand that God's mercy is beyond human comprehension, but is none the less true. The Gospel invites all of us to expand the criteria of our own thinking to have the mind of Christ so we may be merciful, even as our Heavenly Father is merciful. What a marvelous gift we are invited to receive in hearing this message of God's true mercy.

This week, I have been at Graymoor for General Council Meetings of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement. We gather monthly to consider the ministries of the Friars to consistently take a long loving look with God at our life and work for the good of the Church in all that we are called to be and accomplish. Last month the meetings were here held her at St Joan of Arc Parish and concluded with an opportunity to meet with 5 young men who are considering the possibility of religious life for themselves. St. Joan of Arc Parish reflects the life and work of the Friars in our own mission as we attempt to live and proclaim the gospel through the stewardship of our time talents and treasures as a welcoming parish community. It is our hope that the life and ministry of our parish creates a culture that nurtures vocations to religious life that will truly evangelize the world. We are blessed as a parish to be grounded in the universal vision of the Gospel with the particular call of the Friars who are called to realize the At-one-ment that was accomplished by the death and resurrection of Jesus that completed all of the life, work and teaching that is reflected in the gospels. We pray the Holy Spirit will continue to guide us as a parish to be a place of holiness and mercy for all who come here to worship God and find fellowship with us.

In the coming week, we will host the annual thanksgiving barbecue in the friary garden to celebrate the many generous people who contribute their time and talent to make this parish a reflection of the Gospel for others to encounter the Lord Jesus Christ in his mercy and love. To all of you who gather here to worship and participate in the life of the parish, I am deeply grateful.
