The Friar's Nook

There has been a lot of upset this week, and rightly so, over the discovery of the death of children at a First Nations school. Since we don't know when or how they died, there is some confusion as to where to look for an answer. But we know there is plenty of wrong to go around. It certainly was wrong to take children from their families and to try driving their own culture out of them. It was wrong that any abuse should have been tolerated, not simply by the higher ups but by anyone working there. And it's wrong that people have denied its existence for so long and have tried to cover it up!

I cannot imagine the pain of children forcibly removed from their families because of their culture and who they were. I cannot imagine the complicity of the Church in running these schools, even if they were excellent in every other way, based on how they began. I cannot imagine people committed to the faith acting in ways that were so un-Christian. But I also know the ways of the world, and over the last two-thousand years the ways of the Church. The world will do whatever it will to make itself a better place as it's perceived by those in power. The Church should be about making a better world of justice and peace under the guidance and example of Christ.

This calls for faithfulness to Christ not simply by church leaders but by everyone who calls themselves Christian. So, from a principal at these schools down to a janitor everyone should have been looking out for the welfare of these children. And as we know that wasn't happening. How it could have gotten so wrong I do not know. But I do know that over the last two millennia the Church has made grave mistakes and as history unfolds, we hopefully learn from those mistakes of the past. We learn to not repeat them again and to be aware of the situations that led to them in the first place. We should not learn how to cover them up so that we look better. Remember Jesus constantly chastised the Pharisees and the scribes for trying to "look good" rather than "be good." We as Christians must always remember that it is about how we act and what we do that makes us holy, not how we look or appear to others. We must recognize our guilt communally and personally, then admit our faults and pay for our mistakes by doing penance and if we are to be forgiven.

We have a God who wants to forgive us but mostly wants us to do what is right! As I mentioned last week about the mindset of "defending the faith" people have felt they needed to defend the church against any and all wrongs. The best way to defend the church is to make sure that the church follows Christ and does what is right in the world. I remember my mother telling me that as a child some of the kids in her school said that their pastor was an alcoholic. My mother was shocked and thought they were sinners for saying this. But one day as she was walking down the street and saw him coming the other way staggering and incoherent, she started to think that they may be right. However, she thought she was wrong for thinking this! While we are not called to judge one another, that belongs to God, we are certainly called to live up to the expectations of God, caring for the poorest and the weakest in our society. Whenever we see this abused, buy either the government, our society, or the Church, we must cry out.

Those who fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it. These words are especially important in the lives of those in the Church. Anyone who has studied Church history is aware of some of the great mistakes that were made

In the past, under the guise of protecting the faith. If we don't learn from them, then we are gust as guilty as the scries ad Pharisees of whom Jesus said" Your ancestors killed the prophets, but and you build their tombs! Let us look at the past with contrition but especially at the present with compassion that we may not be complicit today for the things that will be revealed in the future.


