THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Peace and all Good to you!

St. Francis always began his greetings with these words and so as Franciscans we often begin our messages with this blessing

It has been a busy week here at St. Joan of Arc. The building committee met last night to discuss the progress of the renovations. The fire alarm system is still being completed, along with some finishing touches to the hall and kitchen. You probably noticed that the concrete has been poured in the outer walls of the parking area, the stairs should be poured next week, and in the first week of July we anticipate that the piazza floor will be replaced to improve drainage to that area. We are hoping that this portion will be completed in about three weeks. We may have some re-direction of foot traffic around to available doors, but there will be handicap access one way or another, perhaps through the hall to the Church entrance. This will be posted as needed.

The delays which many have wondered about involved a change in key contractor personnel, which has occurred and so we are back on track. We also further discussed the next steps in proceeding with the electrical issues that need to be done. As this develops, I will keep you informed. In the meantime James Rooney, the manager of the current project has committed to delivering a weekly report on the progress of the current projects, so we are better informed.

We had our last staff meeting for the summer on Wednesday. Sheila Malloch, our director of religious ed. will be away for the months of July and August. May God give her and her family a wonderful time of rest and relaxation at their summer place. If there are any needs regarding baptisms or religious education issues that cannot wait until her return, please don't hesitate to call the parish office. While we will not have the weekly staff meeting, the parish staff and I will maintain our regular office hours.

We have good news. Cathi Richardson has been hired to work as a consultant Stewardship facilitator to restore and re-energize our various organizations. She will help us to gather new and veteran volunteers to serve our parish growth and functioning. Most of you already know Cathi, because she has been the Chair of our Capital Campaign committee, has worked closely with the building committee and has been the spokesperson to the parish announcing the progress of these projects.

Cathi is a highly skilled organizer and communicator and will be an integral part of our parish team as we work to implement the new structures of the parish council and Stewardship Committees to help us to function fully as a parish community. She will work with the pastoral team as we coordinate our ministerial calendars and interface with the various groups to make the most of our talents and energies in serving the parish. Cathi will help me in being a presence to report to me for meetings where sometimes ministry disallows my being there. The initial year long contract with Cathi is to begin July 1, 2010 and this will be extended as necessary and appropriate. Congratulations Cathi, we welcome you in this new capacity and are grateful that you have accepted this position to serve the parish. Cathi will also continue as a member of the parish, singing at the 10 o'clock Mass and will Chair the Capital Campaign Committee as she has on a volunteer basis.

Please congratulate Cathi on this new position to serve our parish community. May the Holy Spirit guide us as a parish staff as we serve you and encourage the life of Stewardship throughout our parish ministry.

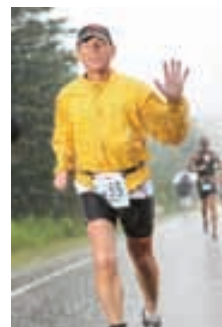
