Living the Gospel by supporting at-risk youth

The single mother of Trinity worried about who might influence her daughter after school, given the presence of gangs in the neighbourhood. She enrolled Trinity in a program at the St. John Paul the Great Family Centre, a ShareLife-funded agency. Along with helping with homework, the centre provided music training that would otherwise be too costly. Now 15 years old, Trinity volunteers at the centre so others can bene. ShareLife envelopes are at the entrance of the church and will be accepted until July 28th. We must have our report and cheque sent to the ShareLife office by July 31.

<u>100th Anniversary: History</u>

1) Fr. Coppens SCJ was transferred and Fr. John Van Damme, SCJ came to help, August 28, 1965. The priests lived in a house at 96 Indian Grove for almost a year. The house was to be bulldozed and they were hoping it would not happen before the new rectory was ready. In 1966 they had to evacuate, as two houses were being bulldozed to make a parking lot for the Dominion store on the corner of Indian Grove and Bloor.

2) The first mass was said in our church, Saturday November 12, 1966. The first wedding that took place here was of the man who drove the first stake into the ground for our church
