This story of St. Joan of Arc has been taken from a previous Parish Bulletin! 2009. From the Parish Office- Rosanne

The daughter of Jacques d'Arc, a peasant farmer, Joan was one of five children and born on January 6, 1414, in Domremy, France. A pious child, she was only 13 when she experienced the first of her supernatural vision. As the time went on, she identified the voices she heard s those of St. Michael, St. Catherine, St. Margaret and others, who she claimed revealed to her that her mission was to save France. The French Commander at Vancouleurs laughed at her attempt to convince him in 1428 that her visions were genuine. But when prophecies she made came true, she was sent the following year to the dauphin, son of the insane Charles VI, who preferred a life of pleasure to mounting the throne with all its responsibilities after his father's death in 1422. The secret signal she gave him convinced him of the authenticity of her mission.

He allowed Joan to lead an expedition to Toulouse. Clad in a suit of white armour, she led her forces to victory and persuaded the dauphin to be crowned King Charles VII in Rheims. The coronation and her expedition relieving the siege of Orleans electrified and revivified all of France. In the spring of 1430, she set out on a new campaign, but was captured and sold to the English by the Duke of Burgandy. She was charged with heresy and witchcraft before the court of Bishop Pierre Cauchon, and her visions were declared to be diabolical. Joan was tricked into a form of recantation on May 23, 1431. She was condemned as a lapsed heretic and burned at the stake Rouen on May 30, the victim of her enemies' determination to do away with her. A court appointed by the Pope Callistus III found her innocent in 1456. Pope Benedict XV canonized her in 1920, not for her military valour or patriotism, but for the virtue of her life and her faithfulness to the prompting of God's grace.

Few women in history have had more written abut them that Joan of Arc. She has been identified as the central figure in a whole literature of controversy. A person who stimulates no controversy or who produces no animus is too bland to be much interest to history! Among the authors who have written well-known works about Joan have been Shakespeare, Voltaire, Lang, Mark Twain, Anatole France, Bernanos, Anatole, Vita Sackville-West and, of course, George Bernard Shaw. And the books keep pouring forth. The late American John Cardinal Wright had over 3,000 books on Joan of Arc in his library. It is a although each age wishes to claim her for its own. Since her death more than 500 years ago, there has been hardly a generation to which she has not served as a fresh example of courage and faith,

Every person has particular reasons for being drawn to another, what is it that draws us to Joan? She is a saint who stirs us; she is a friend, not a lifeless icon. She is more woman than lady. She is admirably warm and human. Her life witnesses to purposefulness, piety, salty wit, shrewdness, courage confidence in God, a high sense of duty and a love of freedom.

The beauty of Joan of Arc is that her principles and ideals were so simply presented that she does not frighten off others from the hope of realizing an approximation of them. In all that Joan did she had an abiding awareness of God's help and maintained total trust in God's faithful love. This is her most important message. It was why she was able to "go boldly".
