The Pastor's Corner

Peace and Goodness to All!

Jesus the light of the world is celebrated on this fourth Sunday of Lent as we read the story of the man born blind from John's gospel. Through this story, we are invited to see more clearly who Jesus is in the world. The unfolding drama demonstrates through the context of his surrounding community, how the man born blind comes to see Jesus first as a man, then as a prophet, then as the Son of God. The story represents the way that Faith presents us with a lifelong journey of gradual enlightenment, inviting us to see with the eyes of our hearts, God's presence and action. This Way is always unfolding to bring us new awareness of redemption and grace in our lives and the life of the world. Those who participate in the RCIA and RCIC programs have been called by God to walk with us in the Catholic Church as they discern their call to participate in the sacramental life of grace in the community of the Church. We are called to witness to them as they give witness to us of their new lives in Faith and conversion. These second Scrutinies recognize the light of Christ who is the Way the Truth and the Life we are all called to follow.

Throughout Lent we will continue our efforts in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These disciplines work together to bring us closer to God, and unite us with others in the journey. Some opportunities to participate in this as a parish are presented in the weekly celebration of the Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings after the 5:30 mass, the ministries retreat on Saturday March 28 from 9:30 to Noon, the Lenten Communal penance service at 7:30 PM on Wednesday March 25th, and the Lenten Soup night on March 24th. The Lenten Soup night gives us an opportunity to contribute to the homeless poor, what we have saved through our Lenten fasting. All of these opportunities permit us to share in the Lenten experience as a community of faith. Let's participate as fully as possible in these events for the life of the parish and for our own growth in holiness and faith.

This past week the Finance Committee met to discuss our upcoming participation in the third wave of the Family of Faith Program of the Archdiocese and our Parish. Together with the Ministries Committee we are identifying the various areas of pastoral, ministerial growth and the capital improvements that will become the focus of our participation in the coming weeks. Let us pray that our participation in this Archdiocesan and Local parish efforts will be life giving and of great benefit to the community.

If there are any members of your families or persons in your neighborhood who are homebound or in hospital and would like to receive the sacraments, please call me or the parish office so that the needs of these people are met in our weekly visitations.

Thank you all for your prayerful participation in the life of our parish. May the Lord continue to guide and inspire us to the fullness of life and grace that is given by the Holy Spirit through our Lenten Journey.


