# The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to all!

The intimate friendship Jesus demonstrates with Mary, Martha and their brother Lazarus is truly one of the best illustrations of divine love made familiar in these human relationships made holy by their faith. What is more, by faith in Jesus, this family experiences the resurrection and the life that Martha and Mary proclaim brought to miraculous expression as Jesus commands: Lazarus to come forth from the grave. In this story the faith of Mary and Martha professed as future hope was brought to their present experience as it is remembered in the miraculous story. There are so many ways that God brings life and healing to each of us who ask for help, Each time our prayers are answered we experience in large and small ways, the power of the resurrection active in our experiences. Each one of these experiences manifests Jesus the Resurrection and the Life active and present in our daily lives and helping us to grow in our faith in the eternal life we are destined to share in God who sent Jesus that we might have life to the full.

Today at the noon mass, we will pray the last of the three scrutiny prayers over our catechumens to prepare them to receive the Easter Sacraments. In the Spirit of John's gospel story that recalls Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead we pray that Jesus the Resurrection and the Life will bring new life and vitality to all who will receive the Easter Sacraments.

Last week I was at Graymoor for General Council meetings. They started Tuesday, so I missed the monthly Merrymakers Luncheon. This time they celebrated the feasts of St. Patrick and St. Joseph which occurred this week.
