# The Pastor's Corner Peace and Goodness to All!

Our Lenten journey is coming to an end as today, Palm Sunday we enter the most holy week of the liturgical year. Today, we gather with people of every race, nation and language with people from every way of life to remember and to celebrate God's love, our gift of redemption won for us by the passion and death of Jesus the Son of God. Through the procession we begin today we commence our celebrations of the sacred events that have brought our salvation in Christ. As we listen to the long scandalous and sorrowful story from the Gospel of Mark, it reveals the betrayal, conviction, condemnation and crucifixion of Jesus. In this we are reminded of the depths of God's love poured out in the bloody humiliation he suffered on the cross for our sins. This memory will be celebrated throughout Holy Week in the liturgical processions that will culminate in the Triduum liturgy of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. The awesome memorial of how it is that God brings about our redemption requires the contemplative time in solemn celebrations which can focus on the sacred events that each of these three liturgies recall. Holy Thursday remembers the gathering and service of Jesus with the disciples to celebrate Passover and to see how this ritual meal is now transformed to become the source of eternal life. Jesus Christ becomes the pascal lamb of God to be slain on the cross. His body becomes our food for salvation, His blood poured out becomes our spiritual drink in the Eucharist. This liturgy remembers also that He came to serve and that he called his disciples to serve others as He served them. On Good Friday, we gather to listen to the passion account from the Gospel of John which remembers the death of the Lord, but already manifests the power of Christ risen from the dead as he bears witness to the truth before Pilate in that gospel's narrative. The power of the one to be lifted up on the Cross is evidenced in this mysterious dialogue. In the Easter Vigil the holiest time of the year is made manifest. In this liturgical celebration, all of Salvation history is remembered in the light of Christ as it illuminates the night and culminates in the proclamation of the Easter Gospel. The Alleluias from this celebration will then echo for the week and the seven weeks that follow. This Easter Vigil also invites the adults and children from the Rites of Christian Initiation to receive the Easter Sacraments for the first time. It is a grand and glorious celebration for all but especially for these new members of the Church and their families. This is indeed the most holy night of the year. We invite you and welcome you to come and participate in this holy time of celebrations and we encourage you, especially to attend the Triduum celebrations of Holy Thursday at 8 PM Good Friday at 3 PM and the Easter Vigil that will commence at 8 PM on Saturday as we bless the Easter fire outside the Church. The schedules for all of the Easter Liturgies are posted in the bulletin and on the website. We hope you will also invite your friends and families to come and celebrate Easter Joy with us.

Thank you to all who participate in the life worship and service of our parish. You are witnesses of the love and power of God that is given to us in Jesus Christ our Savior.


