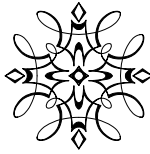

***From Rosanne's Desk***

The first St. Joan of Arc parish bulletin was issued September 15, 1963. In the bulletin of November 17, 1963 was the following notice:

"For Ladies of the Parish, there is an opportunity to make themselves valuable by joining the C.W.L. Leave your name with one of the Fathers after mass or contact Mrs. Mary Doran.

Father Renders was the pastor at the time and recognized a need and a role for an organized group of ladies in the parish. Nineteen ladies answered his call and held their first organizational meeting on November 27, 1963. The first President was Mrs. Mary Doran appointed with a committee of three other ladies along with Fr. Renders to act as an executive until an election could be called.

January 8, 1964, the first official meeting of our CWL was held. Thus, the start of our fund raising, through bake sales, bazaars, sale of Christmas cakes, and catholic calendars. The ladies held monthly raffles and the winner would take home a cake, then provide another one for the next month's meeting.

In 1969, a special meeting was called of the members to decide if the CWL would continue operating as the CWL or become the "Ladies of St. Joan" a secret vote was taken, and the majority decided to stay as CWL. Over the years we sponsored many activities; there was a club named "Do As You Wish", meeting on Tuesday afternoons. When I joined the League in 1977, it had already changed to the "Over 50 Club".

In the 70's, besides holding the various fundraisers we had already established, other projects were tried. A Fashion show, with our members as the models here at the parish, then some fashion shows downtown at Eaton store. We shared the New Year's Eve dances with the Knights of Columbus.

In 1971-72 another vote was taken to decide the fate of the League, it was agreed we should continue. In 1972, the first Sunday of each month was designated as CWL Sunday and the 9:30 am Mass was designated for the CWL. Members handed out pamphlets with CWL information after the masses on Sunday, trying to recruit new members.

We didn't always have a mass before our meetings, our spiritual convener suggested that we start our monthly meetings with a mass, so in 1973, was the start of our monthly masses.

There are a lot more stories, but no space to share it.

If you would like to join the Catholic Women's League, you can join for only \$20.00 a year. You will receive the League Magazine and make some very good friends.

A reminder to our members, 2021 & 2022 Memberships are due. You can give them into the parish office. Only 13 memberships were paid for 2021 and 12 for 2022. We don't want to lose our status as a league and our voting privileges in the league. Cheques payable to the Catholic Women's League of Canada, can be put in an envelope marked "CWL" dropped in with the collection or dropped off at the parish office. \$20.00 per year.
