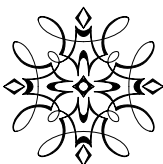

FROM THE DESK OF FR. DAN

Peace and Goodness to All!

Thursday of this week marked the last day of the Papacy of Benedict the XVI. Many have asked me about the meaning of the pope's resignation and I have explained it this way. The pope is an ordained bishop and was appointed Cardinal by the previous pope. He was elected by fellow cardinals to become the bishop of Rome. The bishop of Rome is by definition, the pope. As bishop of Rome, he occupies the Chair of St. Peter who was appointed the head of the Church by Jesus himself as is recounted in the gospel. Eventually St. Peter went to Rome, established the local Church there and became its first bishop. All of those who have succeeded St. Peter as bishop of Rome have been recognized by tradition, as the head of church. When Pope Benedict resigned from his position as the Bishop of Rome, he is simply no longer in that leadership position. His role as successor of St. Peter as the Bishop of Rome is ended. He will continue to be a bishop by virtue of the sacrament of holy orders, and a cardinal by appointment, but the Chair of St. Peter will be vacant until another is elected by the cardinals. Pope Benedict will become the bishop emeritus of Rome and because he is past 80 years of age, he is no longer eligible to vote for his successor. Many of you remember when Cardinal Ambrozic retired, and Cardinal Collins replaced him as Archbishop of Toronto. When he retired he became Archbishop Emeritus of Toronto, retaining his title of Cardinal, but not his position as Archbishop of Toronto. He was honoured as Cardinal Ambrozic until the day he died. In his retirement he was known to be a man of prayer even as his health diminished. Pope Emeritus Benedict will no doubt remain a man of prayer serving the Church until he dies.

You will see that we no longer pray for Pope Benedict by name in the Eucharistic Prayers but mention our Cardinal, the bishops and clergy in general, along with all of the faithful. We will continue in these days or weeks to pray for all of the Cardinals gathered in Rome to elect a new bishop of Rome, and successor to St. Peter and Benedict XVI. May the Holy Spirit guide, protect and inspire them to elect the right person for this role at this time in the life of the Church.

This Third Sunday of Lent, we celebrate the first of the three Scrutiny prayers for our Catechumens in the RCIA program. These rites celebrated on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of lent call for the reading of the Gospels from cycle A of the three year lectionary. We are fortunate to have adult baptisms each year, so we continue the use of this cycle. Since the RCIA program involves the life of the whole parish we will use Cycle A at all of our liturgies. The rites themselves will take place on March 2nd at the 5:30 Mass, March 10 at the Noon mass and March 17th at the 10:00 AM mass. This gives us greater opportunity to share in the RCIA process. Please continue to look at the bulletin and the website for the scheduled times of the Lenten and Holy Week celebrations.

The entire Church throughout the world is gathered in the prayerful Lenten journey that leads to conversion and new life. We pray especially at this holy time that our new leadership will truly guide us to follow in the footsteps of Jesus through the Paschal mystery of his Death and Resurrection to the glory of New Life and New Beginnings for the Church throughout the world.
