

# The Friar's Nook

As we begin the Lenten season, it might seem that I've given up church for Lent. That is not the case, it's just that I have to be away for meetings and retreat over the next few weeks. On the plus side of things, the world is slowly opening back up. We will begin our transition back to full opening by removing the "Closed pews" signs. I would like to take this slow so that everyone feels safe, so you'll notice that while all the pews are available, they will all be marked for social distancing. This will allow us to have more people in attendance at Mass. As our numbers increase, we will move forward with additional steps. I'm not making a lot of changes since I won't be here for a few weeks to supervise them, but I've talked with those who are ministering at these Masses, and they feel that this is a safe way to go. So, at the end of the month, we will see how it's going for us in the parish, and also how things are going in the province. If things continue to improve then we will move on the next stages.

One of the things we will need to work on is getting our ministries back up and running. This means we need greeters, ushers, lectors, eucharistic ministers, altar servers, music ministers, and finally sacristans. Sacristans will serve in a new ministry that coordinates all the ministers at a particular Mass so that it runs smoothly, and the presider doesn't have to run around like a chicken with his head cut off prior to Mass to make sure everything is covered. As people begin to return to church, I am asking you not to simply come to sit in the pews. The pews are firmly fastened to the ground so there is no need to have warm bodies to simply hold them in place! As you can see what we do need is people to participate in the various ministries of the church. So, I am asking everyone as they return to Mass that they think about what it is they can do to serve the congregation. We will be moving to an online scheduling program for ministers. This means that you will be able to indicate when you wish to serve and when you are not available. Since it's a computer program there is no judgment, if you wish to serve only once a month that's fine. As my father would always say "Many hands make light work." Also, if something comes up and you need a replacement you can do that online and it will notify others in your ministry that there is a replacement need for a particular Mass so there's no need to worry about scrambling to call around to find someone to cover you. I have seen this work in other parishes, and it works well and takes the stress off making the schedule and the stress off the ministers. You will be hearing more about this when I return at the end of the month. But meanwhile, think about what you can do, and what you're willing to do.

I have worked my schedule for March so that I only miss one weekend away. The other weekends I'll either be driving or flying in before I have to go again. So hopefully we can celebrate Lent together as much as possible. For Lent, I would like all of our parishioners to go to the archdiocesan website to fill out the questionnaire about the Synod of Synodality, that Pope Francis has called for. There are only 11 questions to which you respond with agreeing or disagreeing and the space for comments on each one. But what I'm asking you for is that you invite your non-churched family and friends to go online and fill this out as well. It is anonymous so they can say how they

truly feel but I think it's so important that we get the thoughts of those who don't go to church anymore as to what we can do to be a more welcoming church community. I realized as does the diocese that 11 questions don't cover everything but it's a start and hopefully everyone's responses will bear fruit for the church.


