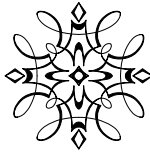

I tried to be as inclusive as possible based on my own experience (although I didn't mention dog moms) but I am glad it was well received. I'm hoping to raise money for the parish to help offset the deficit we had during COVID and the lock down so even if you're not interested in cutting feel free to buy a ticket or two. The cutting will be on Pentecost Sunday June 5th after the 10:00 AM Mass in the hall. Hopefully, our coffee ministry will be up and running by then and we'll have coffee and Timbits© available. I met with a group of people from the parish this week to talk about moving ahead with opening things and getting things started up again. We have a long lethargy after two years but I'm hoping we can spark new interest as the weather gets nicer. We now have a program in place to schedule liturgical ministers online so that it's not overloading any one person or group of people. It takes many people working together to create the celebration of Mass. In fact, the word liturgy means the work of the people. In case you don't know - you're the people.

Prior to the COVID shut down, I was writing a series of instructions on the parts of the Mass in the Friar's Nook. I never got to finish with them because of the pandemic and would like to continue with this as it was well received so keep your eyes open in the coming weeks for this. I am also hoping to have training sessions for each of our liturgical ministries. I have gone over the existing guidelines for each of the ministries and found that even before the pandemic we weren't following our own directions. I have since updated them based on my experience here at Saint Joan of Arc and I'm looking forward to getting them up and running so that we can be a stellar parish in this area.

As I look at the list of ministries here at Saint Joan of Arc, I see some listed that I've never witnessed, some that have fallen into disrepair, and others that have relied too much on one person. We need to renew, and refresh all of our ministries but especially our public ministries so that we provide a good sign to our own parishioners and enable them to go out into the world carrying the good news to others. To this end I've been working on ministry flyers that will be available on the racks at the entrance to the church for you to see what and where you can use your talents in here at Saint Joan of Arc.

We are a parish that has been built on stewardship but too often have we have been relying on the stewardship of others and not asking ourselves "What should I be doing?" We are beginning to restart and renew other ministries and we look forward to your participation in them to make us a parish where truly "all are welcome".

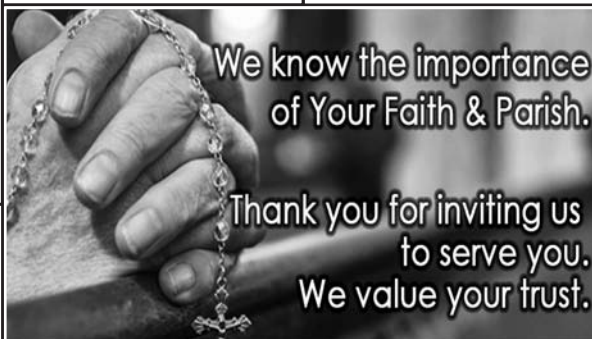

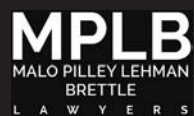
