***The Friar's Nook***

Today we celebrate the feast of the Ascension of the Lord. We used to call it Ascension Thursday because that's the actual date, but it has since been moved to be a Sunday celebration. I can't help but think of a picture I saw from a youngster in a religious ed class as they were drawing scenes from the Bible. There were lots of Noah's arks and Adam and Eve but there was one of a big cloud and a blue sky with two feet sticking out the bottom. Try as I might, I couldn't figure out what it was trying to represent and so I asked the child who drew it what it was. He told me it was the Ascension of the Lord, when Jesus ascended into heaven. I can't think of this feast without that image coming to mind and smiling.

This week I took Bodhi to his first class. It was for dogs who show aggression to other dogs. The teachers relieved me by telling me that it wasn't so much aggression as excitement, and he wanted to play with these other dogs. He did come in first in this class only it was first in the most barking. It was a challenge to get him to stop barking but the teacher said that he's just calling out "Hey I'm here!". She tried distracting him by giving him treats only to have him start barking at her when she stopped giving him treats. She laughed and said "Now he's talking to me because he wants more of my treats." She assured me that in a couple of weeks the barking would subside as we worked together on our homework.

I thought about this while we were at class, that sometimes we try to communicate in a way that doesn't really work well. Bodhi gets excited and wants to play but it sounds like he's going to attack and rip your throat out! I don't think this is just because I don't speak dog because I think people do it in their own lives. We sometimes say things or talk in such a way that it is interpreted by others very differently from what we intended. Just as I need to continue to work with Bodhi on this, I think we need to be aware of it in our own lives and how we communicate to others and how we are received by others. We like to think that we are right and that we're doing it the "right way" when in fact there is no one way that is correct and that we need to be aware of how we come across to others, so that we can actually communicate what we truly want to say instead of what the other person thinks we mean.

That's why I think that prayer is a good way to examine our lives and to try to communicate to God and to others in a way that's gentle loving and kind. Unlike Bodhi, we don't have owners who will try to correct us so we need to be on guard for ourselves that we may present the best of ourselves to others as God presents the best of himself to us.
