After a few days of Summer, Spring is finally here! And with spring new life. We have been working on returning life to the parish after a long pandemic hiatus and we're starting to slowly move in a positive direction. Our money counters, "The Golden Girls" are back at their ministry and it's nice to have life in the building again. We will be starting up our Sunday coffee after the 10:00 o'clock mass on May 29th hosted by the Creation Care Ministry, so it'll be nice to have people back in the hall. If you have been holding out on returning to church until there was coffee, now is the time!

For those of you who are coming to church you'll notice some changes since you last left. We now have touchless holy water dispensers for your safety. Although they are labeled as holy water it tickles me that some people still think it's sanitizer and rub it all over their hands. I'm not sure what it will do against diseases, but I guess you'll have holy hands. There are now new pamphlet racks on the walls at the entrance to the church and chapel. I am currently working on ministry pamphlets to fill those racks with so that as people are leaving the church, they can pick up a pamphlet on ministries they may be interested in.

We need your help in going from surviving COVID to thriving. Even though some of the ministries have not started back up yet, we would like to know what we have in place regarding volunteers so that we can get them back up and running. If you're not already involved, think and pray about what you are capable of, willing to, and called to do.

As for the raffle to cut my long beard off, so far there are no takers. I don't know if it's because you like me with a long beard, you don't care, or you don't want to commit one way or the other. Either way, this beard will be coming off on Pentecost. The fire of the Holy Spirit won't be burning it off but I'm not going through another summer with a hot sweaty neck. If I have to cut it off myself, I will. You might not want to trust me with a pair of scissors. The building committee can attest to this, I borrowed a Sawzall from one of them and removed a wall, install the door, and now there is a large storage closet in Rosanne's office. There's also a religious Ed storage space off of the board room. I'm doing my best to reclaim any space that we can find and store things appropriately so that we can find everything when we're looking for them and that all of our rooms look tidy and are ready for use. Now all I need is for you to come and use them!

I have also fixed the doors to the church so that they remain open when we open them all the way without the need of doorstops. They were designed this way but haven't been working as such for a long time. I did what I'm used to doing, took the door closer apart, found out the problem, and then worked out a solution. I just like having things work the way they were supposed to work. I've also been putting motion sensors on several lights that are routinely left on, so I don't have to chase people around like my father and say: "Turn off those lights!"

I'm encouraged by the people who have reached out to me and talked about the future in our parish. It tells me that I'm not alone and thinking about this as well as planning for it. You are good people and I'd like Toronto and the archdiocese to see that.
