The Friar's Nook

Happy Pentecost! Today we celebrate the birthday of the Church in that the Holy Spirit was given to all the disciples to be spread throughout the world. The Spirit was accompanied by great signs and the Spirit is still at work today in our world and in our lives. We may not always see great signs, but the Spirit is alive still and works in us to do the great things of God. We can get discouraged if we look around to see the power of God in our world and don't recognize it, but we need to remember that God's power works through us - we need to be great signs to the world! It may seem easier to say, "Let somebody else do it", but that's not what being a Christian is all about. It's about taking up your cross each day and following the path, but Jesus has led for us. If you're looking for ways to be invigorated, turn to the Spirit and let it work within you. This past week, I was invigorated in a different way as the water heater at the church went on the blink. Let me tell you there's nothing like washing up with cold water to really wake you up each day. It felt like I was taking a plunge in Lake Ontario and given that where our water is coming from, I probably was. There are things we take for granted in our lives especially in a first world country. Lights, heat, water [especially hot water] don't simply come to us automatically. And I don't mean that we have to pay the bills for all of these but rather that they are truly gifts to us, but we sometimes take them for granted until they're gone. If there is one positive thing to come out of this pandemic it is our realization of how much we need each other. But how often do we take each other for granted? For those of you who live with others, cherish those people as truly gifts from God and treat them as such. For someone who lives alone, I really miss the human interaction [even if it can sometimes drive us crazy]. I hear from Fr. Ken regularly and I Zoom with the General Council at least twice a week but it's not the same as having a living breathing person in your presence. It makes me realize how God does come to us through others.

That brings me back to Pentecost. As the Holy Spirit rushed out upon the disciples and worked in new and powerful ways that they may bring the presence of God to the world it empowers us to do two things. First, to look for the power and the actions of the Holy Spirit in your life and the world. And second, to seek to recognize and welcome the presence of the Spirit in the people in our lives. My hope is that when things get back to some semblance of normal, we don't lose sight of how dear we are to one another. When I talk to my family on the phone now I do so with much more intensity. I find that I listen more deeply and interact more lovingly. I haven't seen them in over a year and while my peers don't change that much, the little ones continue to grow at a great rate. Whenever I see my grandnieces or grandnephews on Facebook, I often say "Stop growing!". I look forward to the day when I can visit them, and they can visit me. In the meantime, I hope they know how much I love them in my absence. So, to those of you who are present to those you love during this lockdown, try to show the Spirit of God in love to them. Don't take them for granted or take the works of the Holy Spirit for granted – it is too precious!

I hope that I remain open to the Holy Spirit and that I can reveal that to you, and I hope not to ever take you or the Spirit for granted.


