It is a great Blessing that our annual celebration falls on the feast of Corpus Christi. This week, our building committee met to discuss the many works of maintaining the facilities that house our mission. Recently it was discovered that our furnace which is only six years old has become burned out even though it has a ten year guarantee. The committee has begun the process to fix the problem and seeking the remedies that are appropriate given this reality. We will need to replace the boiler before the autumn and will probably need to purchase a new boiler. We hope to recoup the warranted costs to some extent along the way. I have decided to run the Ironman race this year to raise funds to pay for the costs, with the hope that whatever we can recoup from warranted sources can be put into the building funds for future needs that will surface as the building envelope studies demonstrate our needs.
